



Week 2

Day 1: God Is With Me Wherever I Go

Scripture Reading: Genesis 39:1-2

Devotional:

Joseph's life changed overnight. One day he was his father's favorite son, and the next he was being sold as a slave in a strange country far from home. That must have felt scary and unfair! But the Bible tells us something very important — "The Lord was with Joseph." Even though Joseph was in a new place with new people and didn't know what would happen next, God never left his side. Sometimes, we also face changes or challenges — maybe moving to a new school, losing a friend, or having to do something that feels hard. We might not understand why things happen, but we can remember this truth: God is always with us. He doesn't forget us when life feels confusing. Because Joseph trusted that God was with him, he didn't give up or become bitter. Instead, he chose to keep doing what was right — working hard, being kind, and trusting God's plan. Even though we can't see God in a physical sense, we know that He is always with us and we can talk to Him all the time.

Discussion:

1. When was a time that you felt alone or afraid?
2. How can remembering that God is with you help you do what is right?

Prayer:

Dear God, help me remember that even when life changes, You never leave me. Give me courage to do what's right, just like Joseph did. Amen.

Day 2: Doing My Best In Everything

Scripture Reading: Genesis 39:3-4

Devotional:

Joseph didn't have an easy job. He was a servant in Potiphar's house, doing work that probably wasn't fun or exciting. But Joseph didn't complain or do just enough to get by. He worked with all his heart, and Potiphar noticed something special about him — that the Lord was with him.

Joseph's good attitude and hard work were a reflection of his love for God. He showed that even ordinary tasks can be done in extraordinary ways when we do them for God. Whether it was cleaning, organizing, or helping others, Joseph did his best because he knew God was watching.

In our lives, we also have things we may not enjoy — chores, homework, or helping a sibling. But when we do our best, we're showing that we care about honoring God. Doing our best is one way of doing what's right! Even when no one is looking or watching we should always try to do our best because we are working for God too. He sees us and is proud of us when we do our best.

Discussion:

1. What is one job or task you can do your best in this week?
2. How can your hard work show others that God is with you?

Prayer:

God, thank You for giving me work to do each day. Help me to do my best in everything, even when it's not easy or fun. Let people see Your goodness in the way I live and work. Amen.



Day 3: Trustworthy In The Little Things

Scripture Reading: Genesis 39:4-5

Devotional:

Because Joseph worked hard and stayed honest, Potiphar began to trust him more and more. Eventually, Potiphar trusted Joseph to take care of everything he owned! Joseph could have taken advantage of that trust — but he didn't. He chose to stay faithful and honest because he knew it was right in God's eyes. God loves it when we are trustworthy — even in the little things. When you clean up your toys without being told, tell the truth when it's hard, or keep a promise you made, you're showing that you can be trusted. And just like Joseph, when we prove we can handle small things well, God prepares us for bigger things later on. Doing what's right in small ways each day helps shape your heart to follow God in big ways, too! Being trustworthy is hard and sometimes it takes a while to build trust with someone but in the end having a relationship built on trust is the best kind!

Discussion:

1. What is one small thing you can do today to show you can be trusted?
2. Why do you think God cares about the "little things"?

Prayer:

Lord, thank You for teaching me how to be trustworthy. Help me to be honest, responsible, and kind, even when no one else is watching. I want to do what's right in every little thing. Amen.

Day 4: God Blesses Right Choices

Scripture Reading: Genesis 39:5-6

Devotional:

Joseph's right choices didn't just bless him — they blessed everyone around him! Because Joseph obeyed God and did what was right, God blessed Potiphar's whole household. Potiphar's work, his home, and his fields all prospered because of Joseph's faithfulness. When we make right choices, even small ones, God can use us to bring blessings to others. Maybe when you choose kindness instead of anger, someone feels God's love through you. Or when you tell the truth, others learn they can trust you. Joseph's obedience changed the world around him — and yours can too!

Doing what's right isn't always easy.

Sometimes others might laugh or think it doesn't matter. But God sees your heart. He rewards those who stay faithful and uses them to do great things, just like He did with Joseph. When we are faithful to do what is right...even with the "little things" in life, we are able to show people the character and love of God.

Activity:

Trace your child's foot on paper and let them decorate it. Write the words: "God is with me wherever I go." (Genesis 39:2) Talk about how God walked with Joseph in Egypt and walks with us everywhere.

Prayer:

Thank You, God, for blessing me when I choose to obey You. Help me to make right choices every day so I can be a blessing to others, just like Joseph was. Amen.
