

A Community Action Poverty Simulation hosted by The Caring Connections Ministry

This is an interactive poverty exercise designed to help participants understand the barriers and realities our lowincome neighbors encounter daily. As a participant, you will gain a deeper understanding of the complex and interconnected issues of poverty and experience the emotional impact of these challenges.

- During a two-hour simulation, participants are assigned roles as members of a family facing barriers of poverty, or as providers of a community resource utilized by a family.
- In the family member role, you are given a card with the unique circumstances your family is facing.
- You will walk through four, 15-minute "weeks" where you must provide food, shelter, and necessities for your family, while managing scenarios related to transportation, healthcare, education and employment, and interact with community resources located around the simulation room.
- At the end, there will be time to discuss what you learned and the emotions you experienced.
