Thanksgiving Isn't Just For Thanksgiving

We all love Thanksgiving for all the right reasons: the love of family and relationships with one another, the best comfort foods of the year, and the reminder to live lives of gratitude. You could add a few more to that list, but you get the idea; it warms our hearts and bellies! The Bible talks about an attitude of gratitude that we are to possess all year long. Here are a few verses to add to your recipes this season of hurry and stress . . .

Philippians 4:6-7 (NIV) Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Or add these from Psalms . . .

Psalm 100:4 (NIV) Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise; give thanks to him and praise his name.

Psalm 107:1 (NIV) Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his love endures forever.

Gratitude looks at the cup of life as half-full rather than half-empty. It guards us from being jealous of what others may have and focuses on what we have. Gratitude is the secret sauce to peace and contentment. I would argue that Gratitude and Thanksgiving are twins. If one walks into the room, you may mistake them for the other, and that's OK! They're OK to be interchanged.

Go ahead and invite them to the table this Thanksgiving. They add life and joy to every table.


Christmas Cookie Brigade
