Make sure that your character is free from the love of money, being content with what you have; for He Himself has said, "I will never desert you, nor will I ever forsake you."



Mandarin Crange Cake

For the Cake:

1 box cake mix, Orange Supreme

4 eggs

½ cup oil

1 can mandarin oranges (include juice and all)

For the Icing:

1½ cups shredded coconut

1 large box of instant vanilla pudding

1 can mandarin oranges, drained

1 large can crushed pineapple, drained

8 oz. whipped topping

Directions:

For the cake, mix all ingredients together for about 2 or 3 minutes. Bake at 325 degrees for 30 minutes or until toothpick comes out clean.

For icing, mix all ingredients together and ice the cake. Keep refrigerated.
