New Sunday School Classes Beginning November 2:

With Reverence and Awe: God takes His own worship very seriously. Therefore, we must approach him "with reverence and awe" (Heb. 12:28). This class will discuss the manner with which we approach God in worship—namely, how we might prepare for worship and how we may rightly attend to the means of grace, for the glory of God and the good of our souls.

The Story of Grace: The Story of Grace, by Horatius Bonar, explores this central truth of the Gospel: that God's love is not earned, but is a pursuing, redeeming force. In this work, Bonar masterfully traces God's free and magnificent grace as the continuous, deliberate initiative of love that spans the entire Bible, from creation to the cross, offering sinners complete reconciliation.

The Book of Isaiah: The prophets of the Old Testament grounded their hopes in the promised Messiah. While believers today look back through faith to the salvation achieved by Christ, the Old Testament prophets look forward through faith to the fulfillment of God's promised salvation. Perhaps no prophet looked forward with such detail and such beauty as Isaiah. We will explore this book in all its history, prophecy, and focus on the promises connected to the Messiah.
