#### Keynote Speaker: Dr. Carlton Wynne

"The Word Above All Earthly Powers"

Dr. Carlton Wynne is an ordained teaching elder in the Presbyterian Church in America (PCA). He served as a pastor in Dallas, TX, before completing a Ph.D. in systematic theology at Westminster Theological Seminary. He then joined the theology faculty there and taught for years before moving to Atlanta, where he serves as Associate Pastor at Westminster Presbyterian Church (PCA). Dr. Wynne's academic interests include trinitarian theology, apologetics, and biblical theology in the tradition of Geerhardus Vos. He is particularly interested in the integration of those areas of study and their bearing on the life of the church. He also enjoys being a husband to Linley and a father to his three sons.

#### Odessa, Ukraine Mission to the World

Bob (a Pensacola, Florida native) met Andrea (from Littleton, Colorado) in 1995 when they both joined a church-planting team in Izmail, Ukraine. Having a passion to tell others of the grace God has offered through Jesus Christ, they married in 1998 and returned to Odessa, Ukraine in 2001 to come along-side national-led Ukrainian churches, with Bob serving as team leader of MTW's church-planting work. Bob & Andrea raised three daughters, Abigail, Emily, and Iris, in Odesa.

Ministry: After the Russian invasion began in February 2022, the Burnhams evacuated to Romania with their team, where they are currently providing for the material and spiritual needs of Ukrainian refugees through the diaspora church plant they began in Brasov. Odesa Team members also travel back into Ukraine almost monthly, to bring in funds, humanitarian aid shipments, move Ukrainians in or out of the country and provide support & encouragement for the Evangelical Reformed Presbyterian churches across the south.

#### Prayer:

- Please pray that God brings Russia's war against Ukraine to a just end, according to His purposes.
- Please pray for our 10 Reformed Presbyterian churches to be faithful witnesses of Christ in word and deed during this time of war, death and displacement.
- Please pray for new believing Ukrainian families to learn how to train up their children in the Lord, and for the Ukrainian church leadership (in Romania) to encourage discipleship at the family level.
- Please pray for the Holy Spirit to open eyes and ears so that the gospel can be heard clearly in all the Ukrainian churches.
- And last, please continue to pray for our daughters:

Though we still maintain a fairly close relationship with her, Abigail (almost 25) has rejected belief in the God of the Bible. Pray that this is not the end of her spiritual redemption story - that she surrenders her will to her Loving Father and follows Jesus again. She is pursuing a career in coding and video game design and currently lives in Lawrenceville GA.

Emily (23) loves God and is seeking opportunities to serve Him locally through Westminster PCA in Rock Hill, SC and through art illustration. She and her boyfriend are discussing marriage later in 2025 - before he starts working as an elementary school teacher for a Title 1 school in the area. We are excited for them!

Our youngest daughter, Iris, (20) is starting as a freshman (mid-year) studying emerging art and animation at UCF in Orlando. This is the time when her faith is tested and must become her own. Please pray that her heart would be fully submitted to and in love with Jesus.

#### Trail Life

Ben Robison, Matt Linton and John Norkus along with five trailmen embarked on the troop Summer Adventure to Oconee State Park on May 31. Ben arranged our route to pass by Swartzentruber's Bakery in Abbeville to pick up pastries for Sunday morning breakfast. We arrived at camp, set up our tents, cooked and cleaned areas and sat down for dinner.

On Sunday, we attended Sunday School and morning worship at Mountain Rest Baptist Church, home to Trail Life SC-9915. In the afternoon, we visited Oconee State Historic Site and got an unexpected tour of the historic buildings by a ranger just coming to file her paperwork. Only later in the week did we find out that the ranger's husband was a Trail Life leader and that once she saw our shirts, she had to open the buildings.

After breakfast and dinner each day, Matt Linton lead us in either discussing a trail badge spiritual question like: How is fire used in the Bible; explain what the scriptures teach us about the "spiritual trail" of Christian life.

He also led through a study developed by **Manhood Journey**, a partner organization with Trail Life USA, on five "big rock" ideas of godly manhood:

- Trusting God Knowing God's Word Praying Fervently Building Relationships –Serving Others Each day during the week had a highlight all its own:
- Monday: Hiking up Tamassee Knob Trail.
- Tuesday: White water rafting on the Chattooga River, Section III
- Wednesday: Morning zip lining, afternoon beginning to find the 24 points on the park orienteering course
- Thursday: Hike the Oconee and Waterwheel Trail and visit the ruins of the Civilian Conservation Corps waterwheel.
  - Afternoon: complete finding the orienteering Stations.
- Friday: Break camp and head home but stop at Swartzentrubers to pick up something for Sunday Fellowship Luncheon.
- On Saturday, June 14, the troop had a Hit the Trail at Active Climbing Gym in Grovetown. We were surprised to find that checking us in and taking our releases was Gracie, who had recognized us when she guided our troop on the Wildwater zip line two

years ago.
Activities will continue in July with our Water Fun Day: water bottle rockets, giant slip n' slide, Wide Water Gun fight.

Now is a great time for young men to check out Trail Life and plan to join us when regular meetings resume in August.





















#### Book Review


Well Ordered, Living Well: A Field Guide to Presbyterian Church Government by Guy P. Waters Why does church government matter? In this book, Guy Prentiss Waters offers a brief and accessible introduction to Presbyterianism that shows how a well-ordered church fosters Christian lives lived well. In making the case that church government is critical to Christian discipleship, Waters presents an overview of the nature of the church (the body and its member) and its structures of authority (officers, assemblies, and ordination). He concludes by answering common questions people raise about church government. The book is an ideal resource for explaining the relevance of church government to the ordinary Christian's life and service.
