

<u>November is Shoebox Collection Month!</u> Stop by the display table in the foyer and take as many shoeboxes as you can fill. Instructions, gift suggestions, and labels are inside the shoeboxes. As you do this, you will be sharing in this exciting project that not only delivers gifts but brings hope, joy, and the message of the Gospel to girls and boys around the world.

Did you know?

- Since 1993 over 232 million shoeboxes have been delivered around the world.
- Shoeboxes are delivered by plane, truck, boat, oxcart, horseback, and even camels.
- This is the only gift many of these children will receive.
- Approximately 50 million boys and girls have been discipled through a follow-up program called <u>The Greatest Journey</u>.
- Since 2009, more than 25 million children have reported decisions for Christ while taking The Greatest Journey.
- Christ Church, Presbyterian has participated in the Shoebox Project for 21 years.
- Shoeboxes filled online go to countries that are hostile to the Gospel.

Missions Matters



TIM & LANA HIGGINBOTHAM

British Columbia, Canada North American Indigenous Ministries

Tim, born in Columbia, SC, moved to Canada as missionary kid in 1970. He met Lana in high school and graduated from Seattle Pacific University in 1991. Lana, born in Richmond, BC, currently works for Trinity Western University as the Director of Operations for the School of Human Kinetics and travels with Tim when she can. They have three adult children - Brooke, Jordan and Madison and a grand-daughter.

Ministry:

It was a blessing to spend time with you all last spring for your Missions Conference. It was good to meet face to face and get to know each other better. Thank you for

your engagement and southern hospitality. Also, for your prayers and support over all these years.

Tim is the Operations Director for NAIM. This entails responsibility for field staff and ministries. This involves travel, wisdom and risk. Missionaries can be an independent lot and are generally located significant distances from leadership and other staff. Our mantra for supervision is personal care, accountability, strategy and advocacy. Over the last five years, we've been especially aware of the impacts of working with a people group that has been through significant trauma. This bears directly on ministry and staff. We are working more proactively towards knowing ourselves and how best to minister with First Nations/Native Americans. Our goal in leadership is to visit field staff 3-4 times per year (face to face and Zoom) so they will remain healthy in all the right areas.

On the flip side, there are great stories of faith from Native Christians. We are communicating these through our video project "This Is My Story." We have created the first batch of these stories and they can be found on YouTube at: https://www.youtube.com/@ThisIsMyStoryNAIM. Our goal is to create a minimum of four of these per year.

Lana continues her job with Trinity Western University as the Director of Operations (the title runs in the family apparently) for the School of Human Kinetics. She generally enjoys her work and has taken on the added responsibility of traveling to China to help setup educational exchanges between two universities. We are both noticing we aren't as young (!) and travel can be tiring (especially overseas). Lana would like to transition in about five years to spend more time with our children and grandchildren (we now have two). Our goal is to plan for how to do that.

Doug and Amy are involved with mentoring and discipling students to prepare them for the mission field. Doug's regular roles at MATA include serving as Bible study coordinator/teacher, technically training students in aviation skills (in particular, maintenance), mobilizing future missionary pilot/mechanics, and producing MATA print marketing materinewsletters.

MATA students receive a well-rounded experience when they attend MATA. The staff seeks to develop students spiritually and technically as future missionary pilots. Also, in addition to regular training and fellowship at the MATA facility, MATA students have opportunities through the year for "extra-curricular" training and service.

- The "Mission Alaska" ministry of MATA offers students an "arena" to challenge and grow their aviation skills while also stretching their ministry skills as they serve with local missionaries in ministry.
- MATA offers a Mission Aviation Summer Camp for teens (14-18 yrs) who have a desire to learn about flight and even serve the Lord in missionary aviation one day.

Praver:

- Prayers for our children are our highest priority. We pray and ask others to pray for the Spirit to reignite the faith they
 professed as children.
- We've had more staff join the organization recently. However, we are not keeping up with the number of staff retiring. Our Recruiting Director is currently on mental health leave so a few of us are taking up her tasks. Our goal is to be better at recruiting this year (trips to Bible schools, communication platforms, networking, etc.).


Monthly Book Review
