

2023 Youth and Family Conference

On October 21, about 30 parents and youth workers gathered at Heritage Free Will Baptist Church for Ohio Student Ministries second annual Youth and Family Conference. Last year's conference focused on equipping youth workers as they "re-engage" with students and families coming out of the pandemic, but this year's focus was equipping parents, while recognizing the partnership with churches and youth workers in raising a godly generation. Thanks to Josh Sorrell, Adam Brown, and Derreck Lute for leading out three keynote sessions, and teaming up for a panel discussion to end the day.



In Josh Sorrell's opening session, "Stay in Your Lane", participants drove home the point that in the freeway of faith, more lanes (ministries) are not always the answer. Discipleship, at its core, needs to happen at home as a part of everyday family life, with the church being there to support families and equipping parents to sure up areas in which they are weak. In session two," Discipleship at Home", Adam Brown walked the group through what a catechism is and how it can help parents instill Biblical thinking in our children. Adam also discussed the importance of at home family worship as a part of the life of Christian families.

In our final morning session, Derreck Lute gave advice

on discipling children at different stages of life in his presentation "Christ Formed in Youth". COLLEGE

Welch College and Welch Divinity School are seeking to assist our pastors with quality, affordable programs in ministry, theology, and biblical studies. We currently offer three programs that local pastors may find beneficial.

First, Welch Divinity School is pleased to offer a fully accredited, residential MDiv degree. The Master of Divinity program is designed for students looking to prepare for a lifetime of service in pastoral ministry, chaplaincy, or academia. The MDiv is an 85-hour program designed to be completed residentially, with some online components. Qualifying undergraduate students may be admitted to the accelerated BA-to-MDiv program. The accelerated BA-to-MDiv allows students to complete both their undergraduate and graduate studies in a timeline of only 5-6 years. It is our prayer that this MDiv program is used to train serious leaders in theology, biblical languages, and ministry to be used by God to further His kingdom. Please pray with us that God would send students to further build this MDiv program. Those interested in the MDiv program may go to welch.edu/divinity for more information.

Second, the Welch M.A. in Theology and Ministry is becoming a popular program with pastors and ministry leaders who want quality, online education to aid them in their local church ministry or study of Scripture. The Welch MATM degree is an advanced degree that focuses on developing skills and knowledge in the area of Christian ministry. There are two tracks specially designed to meet student needs: the traditional track has a thesis component for those who wish to pursue further studies, and the ministry track includes a course from the Welch MDiv degree

This program is perfect for a full-time pastor who is interested in deepening their knowledge of Scripture and improving their education in ministry and theology. Terms are every eight weeks, and classes are offered in a hybrid format incorporating Zoom class meetings and individual reading and writing assignments. All classes in the MATM program meet virtually once a week. Those interested in the MATM program may go to welch.edu/matm for more information.

Our new Certificate of Biblical and Ministry Studies is geared toward those who might not have a college education or have a degree in a completely secular field. The certificate is a fifteen-hour program designed to give students deeper knowledge in biblical studies and church leadership. Terms are every six weeks. This program is an incredible, extremely affordable opportunity for bi-vocational pastors, Sunday School teachers, or anyone who would benefit from a Bible College study through Scripture and discipleship without the time to physically attend college. Students will take Bible surveys and discipleship courses. Anyone interested may go to welch.edu/certificate to learn more.

We ask that local churches continue to pray for our Welch students. Pray that God would give them clarity and focus as they study; that God would use our graduates to further His kingdom; and that God would send more students to our ministerial and MDiv programs. There is a great need for pastors and church leaders in our day and age, and Welch Divinity School wants to help fill that need. 

Greetings from the Embark Crew! It has been a busy few months since the last Ambassador came out and we are excited to share this news with you! We had a great time at the National Convention and made a lot of connections with pastors and individuals. August was slow month travelling for us, but it picked up for a moment in September and October. God has been blessing the work so much and we are just amazed at what He is doing.

Supporting missions is an act of faith, an investment in the eternal, and an opportunity to share the life-changing message of Christ. It allows us to partner with missionaries who bring hope to the lost and the hurting. Consider the words of Romans 10:14-15: "How then shall they call on him in whom they have not believed? and how shall they believe in him of whom they have not heard? and how shall they hear without a preacher? And how shall they preach, except they be sent?"

If you did not see on our Facebook page, we officially reached 50% in monthly support! It has been a grind, but I am so thankful to those who have stepped up to financially partner with us. We still need to raise around \$2,500 in monthly support to be fully funded and I have set a goal to see us fully funded by the end of the year. If you have not had us in your church, please get into contact with me.

And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and pre- serve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ."
