LEVELS OF BIBLICAL LEARNING // JESUS

Iesus will one day return to exercise His reign over creation, and He will make all things new.

My wife loves roller coasters and theme parks, and recently she and her best friend from high school made the trip to Cedar Point in Ohio for three days. I was happy for her to go. However, another part of me was intimidated about her being away for several days. You see, we have six kiddos, and though I love my kids more than life itself, the cooking, cleaning, and home-schooling duties are outside of my comfort zone. Three days doesn't seem like a long time, but I was legitimately concerned about how things might go with my wife away.

I'm happy to report that all the kids survived, and there were no trips to the hospital. But, let's be real—both the kids and myself were thrilled when my wife pulled in the driveway. We made it, but things just weren't quite right while she was away. We couldn't wait for her return!

Jesus told His disciples that He would go away for a time but He would return for His people. When He does, He'll bring an end to sin and suffering. LEVELS OF BIBLICAL LEARNING // JESUS

> CHRIST

>COMMUNITY

We live in a world where because of the fall, pain and brokenness are naturally a part of it. Life is tough, and we are called to love and encourage the people in our church family even more when we see the day of Jesus's return approaching (Heb. 10:25).

This week, identify someone in your church who might be discouraged.

12 Find a way to offer this person real encouragement. Remind him or her that Iesus will return soon and restore all that sin has broken.

> CULTURE


Day One **HEBREWS 9:22-23**

Under the Old Testament law, worship was expressed through sacrifice. At times, water, incense, or fire were used in ritual purification; this is why the author of Hebrews used the language of "almost" or "nearly" in verse 22. But the most common means of purification was, by far, the blood of sacrifices. Ever since the fall, people are sinful and all stand in need of God's forgiveness. There are consequences for sin, and the ultimate result is death. Because God is just, His character doesn't allow for Him to simply excuse our sin, and because we have sinned, we must die. However, God did allow for one exception: Someone could die in our place. In the Old Testament, God offered forgiveness when the life of an animal was offered in place of the people. However, the tabernacle and the sacrifices were only symbols that pointed to Jesus, who would ultimately pay the price for our sin. Jesus is the better sacrifice! Only His blood could truly pay the price for our sin.

Why did God require a sacrifice for sin?

Day Two HEBREWS 9:24



On the Day of Atonement, the high priest entered the holy of holies to present a sacrifice before God as payment for the sins of the people. This was the sacrifice that allowed the people to experience God's forgiveness. But there was a catch: The sacrifice only applied in a temporary sense, and the forgiveness was offered only for another year. The sacrifice would have to be completed over and over again, for the ritual was only symbolic of something better to come. The high priest entered into an earthly tabernacle, but Jesus entered into heaven, directly into the presence of God as our great and perfect High Priest. And He went not with an animal as His offering but with His own blood for the eternal forgiveness of all who would trust in Him. Our salvation is secure, and we don't have to worry about future sacrifices for the forgiveness of sin. Jesus paid the eternal price with His own blood.

Day Three **HEBREWS 9:25-26**

The high priests entered into the holy of holies on the Day of Atonement every year. The animal sacrifices demonstrated the people's trust in God and their commitment to obeying Him. However, the forgiveness from God was only offered for one year at a time. When Jesus offered Himself, everything changed. When Jesus died on the cross, His blood paid the price for sin in a way that no other sacrifice was required—ever! God requires no more sacrifices for the forgiveness of sin. When Jesus entered the presence of God with His blood, our debt was paid in full! Jesus suffered once and bore the weight of God's wrath on sin. and this sacrifice was sufficient. Because Jesus is sinless, death had no claim on Him. He rose from the grave and defeated sin and Satan, and He's allowed us to share in His victory. This is the reason He came to earth: to preach the gospel, die for the sins of the world, and defeat death. Further, He came to invite sinful people who would trust Him to experience the forgiveness He's made available.

Day Four **HEBREWS 9:27**

Because we have sinned, all people will die. Physical death is the natural consequence of our pride and rebellion. However, even worse than physical death is the spiritual death all people will experience apart from knowing Jesus. The Bible speaks of multiple judgments to be carried out in the future, including the judgment seat of Christ (2 Cor. 5:10), the judgment of the nations (Matt. 25:31-46), and the great white throne judgment (Rev. 20:11-15). This verse in Hebrews speaks of individual judgment (see also Luke 16:19-31; 2 Cor. 5:8), where our eternal destiny is determined based on our faith and the ways we've lived while on earth. God has called all people to take responsibility for their choices. He's called us all to repent of sins and to trust in Jesus. We will die, and after, we will be judged. For those who refuse Jesus, it will be too late after death. Today is the day of salvation.

Day Five **HEBREWS 9:28**



On the Day of Atonement during Old Testament times, the people waited anxiously for the high priest to come out of the holy of holies. The priest was responsible for offering a sacrifice before God on behalf of the people, and when he came out, the people knew that the sacrifice had been accepted by God and their sins were forgiven. Jesus offered Himself as a sacrifice for the sins of the world, and He entered into heaven, the true holy of holies, before God on our behalf. When Jesus returns, it will be a sign to all believers that Jesus's sacrifice was sufficient and accepted by God as payment for our sins. Because of sin, all people will die, and we will face judgment. But, thank God, Jesus will come again and bring final, complete, and eternal salvation to all who trust and follow Him.
