And after that no one dared to ask him any more questions.

BIBLICAL LEARNING // PEOPLE

Our response to God's love is to remain pure in all aspects of life—with our bodies, thoughts, attitudes, actions. and speech—and He empowers us to obev His commands as we live by the Spirit.

What's the "one thing"? Many people at the top of their game, whether in business, sports, or music, are asked how they got to where they are. They may be asked questions like, "What's the one piece of advice you could share to help others be successful?" or, "What's a trap you see others fall into that keeps them stuck?"

People want a one-thing, secret-sauce answer to finding success. They try a new diet, thinking that the next one will surely have the one thing that will help them lose weight. They read another self-help book, thinking it will have the one piece of advice to relieve their anxiety. However, growing and thriving is never a one-thing issue. Instead, being healthy involves commitment, discipline, and making good choices in all areas of our lives.

Jesus was asked a one-thing question. A scribe, an expert in the law, observed Jesus engaging with the religious leaders. Impressed with how Jesus handled His accusers and their questions, He asked Jesus a question of his own: Which of the commandments is the most important? (Mark 12:28). Jesus gave the man a clear answer, and what Jesus said has fascinated philosophers and everyday people ever since.

Day One **DEUTERONOMY 6:1**

Deuteronomy was written to the people of Israel as they prepared to enter the promised land. The generation that came out of Egypt had died in the wilderness, and those who would enter the land hadn't seen God's power demonstrated through the plagues or the parting of the Red Sea. They hadn't been present when God gave the Israelites the law at Sinai. As they entered the land, there would be many temptations and dangers, and Moses wrote Deuteronomy as a reminder of God's law and power and of the importance of obedience. The statutes and ordinances of the law weren't simply a list of rules—they also taught the Israelites how to live set apart from pagan nations by following God's purpose for His people. Further, the law revealed the character of God and showed them how to reflect His goodness. Obedience to the law was essential.

Day Two

DEUTERONOMY 6:2-3



In this passage, we are taught to fear the Lord (an awe and reverence of who He is) and do what He commands. This may lead us to earthly blessings, but more than that, it leads us to closer fellowship with God. God had given the commands to His people so that they would know how to live to please God, which put them in a unique position out of all the people of the world. In Romans 3:1-2, Paul asked what advantage the Old Testament Israelites had. Then he answered his own question: Their advantage was that they had God's law. If they wanted God's blessings, not only for themselves but as an inheritance for future generations, all they had to do was to be careful to fear the Lord and follow His commands.

Day Three **DEUTERONOMY 6:4**

This verse is the beginning of what is known as the Shema, which means "listen" or "hear." God was saying to His people, "Pay attention, because what you're about to hear is absolutely foundational." When God gave the law at Sinai, the first of the ten commands taught the people they were to have no other gods besides the Lord (Ex. 20:3). All the other laws would flow from the truth that there is one true and living God. The idols of the nations are nothing, and God alone deserves our devotion. The Israelites were to give their undivided attention to the truth in the Shema that "the Lord is our God, the Lord is one." Living continually in light of this truth was central to experiencing blessings.

Day Four **DEUTERONOMY 6:5-6**

Earlier in verses 1-3, God had emphasized the importance of obeying the law. If we paid close attention, we might have noticed that God mentioned not only obedience, but also fear of the Lord. The people were to obey in the spirit of proper reverence. However, God provided even further qualification for the obedience of His people. At times, we might think that the New Testament teaches grace and love, but that the Old Testament lifted up a faith based on legalistic standards. However, this simply isn't the case, and these are the verses (among others) that make this truth perfectly clear. Yes, God had clearly communicated the importance of obeying the law. But He also emphasized the essential nature of obeying from a heart of love for God. The people weren't to obey in an effort to earn God's favor. Instead, they were first to love God with every part of themselves and to obey simply as an expression of that love. The law had been written on tablets of stone, but God's people both then and now have always been responsible to see those laws transferred onto our hearts.

Day Five **DEUTERONOMY 6:7-9**



The Shema emphasizes the importance of believing in the one true God, obeying the law, and loving God with all we are. Finally, the Shema emphasizes the importance of passing down an inheritance of faithfulness to future generations. At creation, God called people who were made in His image to lives of fruitfulness and multiplication. This applies not only in a physical sense but also spiritually. This multiplication of faith happens when we set our hearts and minds on the truth of God over and over again every day and when we speak repeatedly of God's truth with the people in our lives. God's Word is to be a permanent fixture in our lives and those closest to us. And it's not just a matter of knowing the truth but of living it.
