LEVELS OF BIBLICAL LEARNING // JESUS

Jesus is fully God and fully man, and despite being tempted while on earth, He remained altogether free from sin. For our senior class trip, my classmates and I took a cruise to Mexico. Most of the recent graduates on the trip were good kids, and many were regularly involved in church. But many of their choices on the trip weren't in line with what they'd claimed before leaving. Throughout the trip, I was casually invited (and even pressured) to engage in behavior that was unbecoming for a follower of Jesus. I kept to myself for large amounts of time during the trip, but because I tend to be introverted and am happy to keep to myself, I still had a great time! On the last day of the cruise, two guys in my class asked me how I'd refused to give in to the pressure to engage in bad behavior. In fact, they didn't need me to tell them, because they already knew the answer—it was because I took my faith seriously. These two friends shared how much they respected me, and they wished they had been more consistent in their own actions.

Integrity means "unbroken" or "undivided." Sadly, many professing Christians today live in ways that don't line up with their claims. The truth is that I'm desperately far from perfect. It's also true that I do my best to follow Jesus, and there was no way I was going to ruin my testimony by doing a bunch of dumb stuff in Mexico. For the Christ follower, integrity is not an option. We are called to be the same person—one who follows Jesus—no matter the situation.

### Day One **PSALM 86:8**

The Psalms are a collection of prayers, poetry, and songs intended to focus the worshiper's heart and mind on the nature of God. The Psalms deal with a broad range of subjects, and Psalm 86 is a song of lament, or mourning. David opens with a request for God to give him grace because David felt poor and helpless and may have been experiencing an immediate threat on his life. The way David dealt with this grief was to focus on the nature and goodness of God. If he'd focused on all that was going wrong, David could have fallen into despair and hopelessness. However, as we see in these verses, David set his mind on the power of God. People worship all kinds of things, but there's no one and no thing that can provide for our needs as God can. When we're tempted to be afraid or feel overwhelmed by life's challenges, let's remember that we serve a God who is infinite in power and knowledge. And He loves us!

#### Day Two **PSALM 86:9**



When we take a look around, it might seem like the world is headed in the wrong direction. Movies, music, and TV shows contain all kinds of filth; the news reports violence and brokenness all around the world: social media is filled with unhealthy interactions; and even in our schools, we commonly see people behaving in ways that are less than uplifting. Thankfully, things aren't all bad, and there are many people who are kind and strive to do right. However, what the Bible teaches is true—the world is opposed to God and fallen people will live selfishly. Though we might not see it now, the world is moving toward a time when all people will bow before Jesus. We are called to pray and work for Jesus's kingdom to come to earth. At any given moment, it might not seem like we're making a big difference. Nevertheless, let's press on in obedience. The day is coming when all will recognize Jesus as Kina!

### Day Three **PSALM 86:10**

When Jesus was on earth, He performed many signs and wonders (Acts 2:22). He turned water to wine and healed the diseased. He fed thousands with only a few pieces of food, walked on water, and raised the dead. Jesus didn't do these things to prove He is God. Instead, Jesus performed wonders to help people overcome their struggles to believe. We serve a God of wonders who demonstrates His power so that we would believe and our belief would move us to worship. As David wrestled with the challenges of life and the associated emotional struggles, he intentionally remembered the wonders God had done on behalf of His people. Today, we live in an age where we might not see signs and wonders like those performed by Jesus or the apostles. Still, we serve a God of wonders who is infinite in power and who ministers supernaturally to His people. When you feel overwhelmed with life's struggles, commit to right living, take time to pray, and trust the great God of wonders.

#### Day Four **PSALM 86:11a**

It's one thing to know the truth. It's something altogether different to live it out. A lot of churches operate as if discipleship is defined by knowing more and more of the Bible. Let's be clear—knowing the truth of Scripture is foundationally important in the lives of Christ followers. However, knowledge is not the goal. True discipleship is marked by knowing that leads to doing. As Christians, we are called to follow Jesus. We are called to have the mind of Christ (1 Cor. 2:16; Phil. 2:5), which means we are to understand life, faith, and reality in ways that reflect the understanding of Jesus. Further, we are to see others with the same grace and compassion that Jesus did. However, following Jesus applies to more than our understanding. We are to follow Jesus in all the ways we live. We are, in all we say and do, to live as Jesus lived. Remember, David wrote this psalm when he was in a desperately tough situation. Even in this place, he prayed that God would reveal the truth, and David committed to following wherever God might lead. Where God leads might not always be comfortable and easy. Still, we are called to follow Him. It's always the best way to live.

### Day Five **PSALM 86:11b**



In today's world, many people have divided loyalties—even Christians. It can be easy for us to come to church, to sing and pray, to hear the Scriptures taught, and to commit our lives to Jesus but also be tempted to love the things of the world. David, in a sense, confessed this kind of division in his life. Given the challenges he faced, he may have been tempted to take matters into his own hands or to respond in ways that didn't reflect the nature of his God. Because of his devotion to God, David didn't want this kind of division in his heart, and he knew that the only way to experience the kind of internal unity he desired was for God to supernaturally align his desires. Today, we are all likely divided in different ways. Let us pursue consistency and congruence in every area of life, and let's pray that God would shape us to be whole-heartedly devoted to Jesus.
