2 YEAR OLD PROGRAM

Our 2 Year Old Program focuses on the emotional and social development of the child. This is a crucial, fundamental building block for children. The preschool group experience offers a tremendous opportunity for little ones to interact with each other while simultaneously learning about themselves. It is a wonderful environment in which to build self-esteem and offers them experiences that they can then take home and share with the family.

The Curriculum is enriched through our monthly themes, which incorporate social studies, science, health & safety, mathematics, art, and STEM. Being a Christian Preschool, our monthly Biblical Themes, and Biblical Truths are integrated and woven throughout the curriculum. Each day brings many opportunities for the teacher to naturally teach about the Love of Jesus and how He would have us be a good friend. A thematically based curriculum lends itself to making connections between concepts, ideas, language development, and vocabulary building.
