God's Holy Spirit in our life, we can navigate life's intersections and manage life's transitions with hope and confidence, rather than with fear and despair.

As the school year approaches, as ministries gear up for a busy fall, and as the world continues to challenge our faith and hope, we are invited to walk in step with the Spirit. Fearing transitions can close us off from God's Spirit. But Faith confidently invites God's Spirit to be part and parcel to the intersecting seasons of our life. This invitation to walk with God's Spirit transitions desolate intersections into fruit-bearing hubs in our lives. And what a farmer's fruit stand it is, with the Spirit bearing the fruits of love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control!

What might it look like to walk in the Spirit this August? Perhaps it's spending a few extra minutes in prayer each morning, asking God to guide your day. Perhaps it's reaching out to a neighbor who is lonely or in need. Perhaps it's volunteering with a ministry in our community or helping prepare FELC for fall programs focused on bolstering the proclamation of the gospel through worship, song, study, or service.

Even small steps, when guided by the Spirit, can lead to big changes - not only in our lives but also in the lives of those around us. Every time we head into transitions with the faith and focus of keeping "in step with God's Spirit" it can lead to producing large fruits - not only for our lives but also for the lives of those around us. As your pastor, I invite you to reflect on how God is calling you in this season. Let's enter the coming months with open hearts, ready to be led by the Spirit and to share the love of Christ with all we meet.







 it out.

I'd be afraid to make a mistake in front of all those people. It happens to all of us; I don't think we have ever played a piece perfectly, and the reality is that very few people in the congregation recognize that. And the intent here is not to play during worship, but to see if we have some people who might be interested in continuing to learn. Also, we don't set choirs or their individual members up for failure — that's not praising God

FALL SUNDAY SCHOOL UPDATE!

We have a good problem!

We have more students; that's a good thing!

The problem is, now we need more volunteers!

Last year our elementary age Sunday School class would often have 12 or more students from age 6 to sixth grade.

Because of this growth and challenging range of ages, this fall we hope to divide the elementary age Sunday School into two groups:

Early Elementary (K-2nd) and Upper Elementary (3rd-6th).

We plan on having three teaching teams for each age group. These teams could rotate their responsibilities so no team has to teach more than twice a month. FELC insists on teams (2-deep leadership), not just because its good for the classroom environment and eases the burden for teachers, but it also provides a safeguard for both our staff and students. That means we need a minimum of 12 volunteers (6 teams of 2) for our fall Sunday School Staff. The good news is we already have commitments from 9 individuals. It's not even September and we're only three people short of a full staff. Is God nudging you to "let the children come to him" through helping with Sunday School? If so, contact either our Christian Education Chairperson, Kim Dean, or our Sunday School Superintendent, Karen Bateman.




SUNDAY SCHOOL STAFF ORIENTATION

teaching resources, and safety protocols.


