Let us then throw off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light; ¹³ let us walk decently as in the day, not in reveling and drunkenness, not in illicit sex and licentiousness, not in quarreling and jealousy. ¹⁴ Instead, put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.

Yet, for us Lutherans, we view the weeks leading up to Christmas day as a time of preparing our hearts and homes for the promised Messiah of old and the victorious Messiah’s return.

Today we enter the season of waiting and watching, preparing and praying that is the Advent season. And while it looks much different from the chaotic way the world leads up to Christmas, in many ways it’s better. Instead of a preoccupation with getting, we can focus on giving. Instead of having to do a thousand things, Christians try during this time of year to whittle down to doing the important things. And it’s important to remember to “keep Christ in Christmas.” FELC hopes to help you “keep Christ in Christmas” by offering meaningful **Sunday Advent services** as well as **midweek Advent worship**.

FELC ADVENT DEVOTIONAL BOOKLET

Many members have said they’ve shared this booklet with neighbors and family to help explain Advent as well as share the encouraging advice regarding various ways for families to make meaningful traditions that keep “Christ in Christmas.” Additionally, the readings for the lighting of each of the Advent candles can be found in the back of the booklet. These booklets are free and are at the Welcome Window.

THE HOLY GOSPEL (*Pew Bible p. 806*) Matthew 24:36-44
The Holy Gospel according to Saint Matthew, chapter twenty-four, beginning with verse thirty-six.
Glory to you, O Lord.

[Jesus said to the disciples,]³⁶ “About that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father.³⁷ For as the days of Noah were, so will be the coming of the Son of Man.³⁸ For as in the days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day Noah entered the ark,³⁹ and they knew nothing until the flood came and swept them all away, so, too, will be the coming of the Son of Man.⁴⁰ Then two will be in the field; one will be taken, and one will be left.⁴¹ Two women will be grinding meal together; one will be taken, and one will be left.⁴² Keep awake, therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming.⁴³ But understand this: if the owner of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into.⁴⁴ Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.”

CHRISTMAS EVE SERVICES

FELC will have two worship services on Christmas Eve. The first service at 5:00 pm will be "family friendly." It includes communion and the traditional candlelight ceremony, but Pastor Mike's message will be "family friendly." The messages will be based on the Christmas Hymn of the "Friendly Beasts." Pastor will have 3 separate, short children's messages based on the friendly beasts that were at the first Christmas: a sheep, camel, and donkey. The length of each message accompanied by quick costume changes, tend to keep wound-up kids and exhausted parents engaged long enough to enjoy some Christmas joy. The service ends with the sharing of communion followed by the traditional candlelight ceremony of singing "Silent Night."

The later Christmas Eve worship service will be at 7:30 pm. It will feature a more "traditional" message, as well as feature one of our musical groups, along with the sharing of communion and traditional candlelight ceremony of singing "Silent Night." 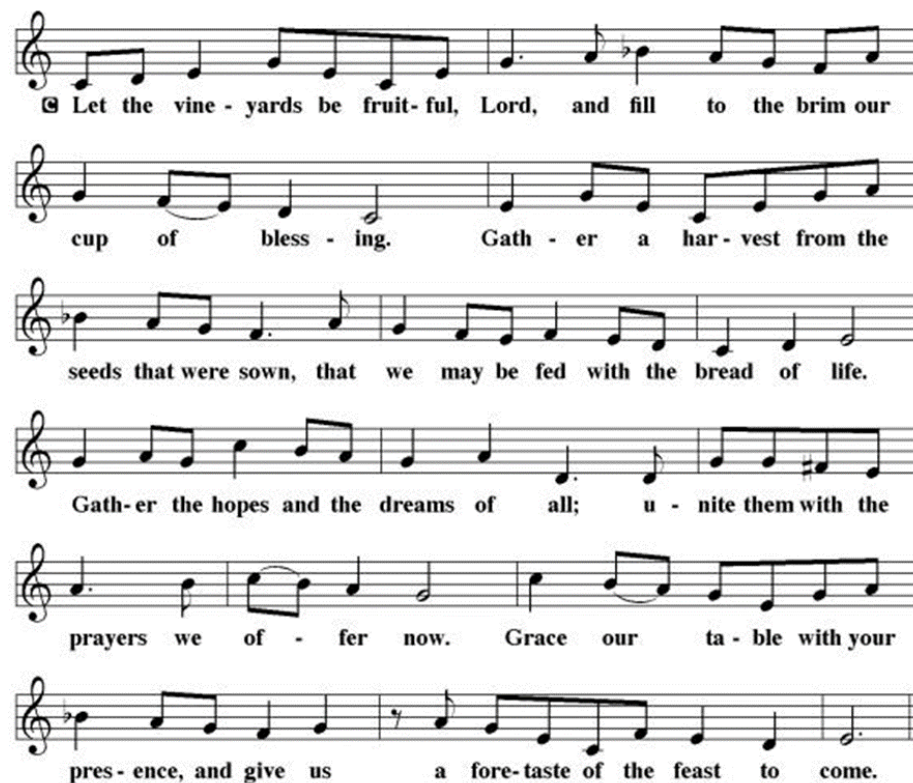
