

THURSDAY NIGHT BIBLE STUDY

Every Thursday night, I lead a Bible study for a group of young men who aspire to sign professional baseball contracts. Most won't reach that goal, but the discipline and hope they carry make them incredibly receptive to truth.

We've been working our way through the Gospel of John a few verses at a time. Not long ago, one of the guys asked me, "How do I know if I'm growing?" That question opened the door to something new—I've started writing and printing out weekly devotionals for the group. Each Thursday, I hand out a new sevenday devotional to help them dig into Scripture throughout the week.

We've also started using baseball cards as a way to encourage engagement and participation. You'd be surprised how motivating those little cards can be!

Please pray for a new project I'm working on. I've started writing a fictional story about a young baseball player who uses the game as a backdrop to teach biblical truth. I hope that it becomes a tool that helps more young players understand who God is and how much He loves them.

Looking Back, Moving Forward

Though our time in Venezuela feels like a lifetime ago, the recent departure of our older boys has stirred up a lot of memories from that season—especially for them. It's reminded us just how much God did during those years. Many people encouraged us back then to write those stories down, and we have finally done so.

I've compiled our experiences into a book, now available on Amazon in both Kindle and paperback formats. The book is titled "Where Grief Meets Grace." This isn't a sales pitch—just a heads-up in case you or someone you know would be encouraged by our journey. The book is a reflection on God's faithfulness through years of hardship and provision.

We also ask you to pray for a dear friend's father, Enderson. Enderson is Enmi's dad. We disciple Enmi and her husband in Venezuela. Enderson has cancer and is not doing well. He has made a profession of faith.
