

SUMMER REVIEW 2025



More than 40 years ago, my friend, Tim, and I walked along the ridge of La Meije, one of the highest 13,000 foot mountains in the French Alpes. From that **vantage point**, we could clearly see the valleys on both sides, where we came from, and where we were going. This summer I experienced that familiar feeling several times, in different contexts.



Many of our regular seasoned summer workers join us again this year. Some have been coming for 20 years. They were joined by those who came for the first time, and who now hope to return. It was great to see the veterans training the next generation of counselors and service team helpers. From our **vantage point**, we can look back and see how God has raised people up to help us, and how He is raising up a new generation of workers for the future.



Our first family camp was filled with mostly familiar faces, families who have been coming for many years. The children of these families were 5-6 years old when we first meet them, and we've had the privilege of watching them grow up. Now they are in their 20s and helping us in the camp programs. These young people are also actively involved in their churches and various ministries all across France.



At our second family camp we had many **new** families, along with several former campers who are now married and have children of their own. For this session we had a lot of younger kids 0-13 years old. From our **vantage point**, it's easy to believe that this is our next generation of French counselors that we will have the privilege of watching grow up and put their faith in Christ. It was a blessing to see those who were once our youngest campers, who are now young adults, helping in the children's programs and helping raising up the next generation of Christ followers.

From the **vantage point** of having spent many years in France, it's a great blessing to look back and see all that God has done in the lives of our campers and helpers over four generations.

I do not believe in "quantifying" results, as God alone sees the heart. But we can look all across France and see former (and current) campers who have put their faith in Jesus and are actively engaged in the work of the Church. We see pastors, elders, missionaries, church leaders, evangelists, discipleship leaders, Bible school teachers and students, youth and university student leaders, and even Camp des Cimes staff whose salvation, discipleship, and call to ministry have their path through the Camp.

"There's something about this place. I can't explain it, but God does things here."



This was a reoccurring theme that I heard several times over the summer. God once again showed up and met people and touched hearts in this little mountain village tucked away in the French Alpes.
