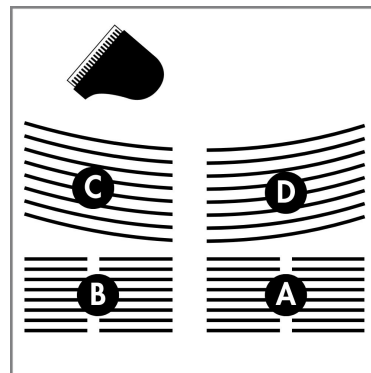
First time, all sing unison.

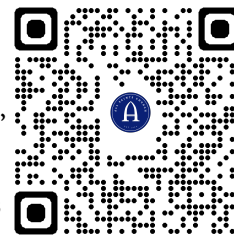
