Blot out our transgressions, wash us from our iniquities, deliver us from bloodguiltiness. Forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. Have mercy upon us, O Lord, in Jesus' name. Amen.

Silent confession.

Minister: But when the fullness of the time came...sins are forgiven in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen.

Congregation: Thanks be to God. Our sins are forgiven in Jesus' name. Amen.

Minister: Arise, lift up your heads and believe the good news! God, our heavenly Father, has had mercy on us!

Congregation: O come, let us worship Him. Hallelujah!



## Psalm 107:1-12

- 1 <u>Give</u> thanks to the <u>LORD</u>, for He is <u>good</u>, and His <u>mercy</u> en<u>dures</u> for <u>ever</u>.2 <u>Let</u> all those whom the <u>LORD</u> has redeemed pro<u>claim</u>
- 3 <u>He</u> gathered them <u>out</u> of the <u>lands</u>; from the east and from the west, from the north and from the south.
- 4 <u>Some</u> wandered in <u>desert wastes</u>; <u>they</u> found no way to a <u>city</u> where they might <u>dwell</u>.

- 20 He <u>sent</u> forth His <u>word</u> and <u>healed</u> them and <u>saved</u> them <u>from</u> the <u>grave</u>.






## Psalm 117 Instructions
