Silent confession.

Minister: The true light, which gives light to everyone, was coming into the world and to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God. Therefore, as a minister of the Gospel, I declare that your sins are forgiven in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen.

Congregation: Thanks be to God. Our sins are forgiven in Jesus' name. Amen

Minister: Arise, shine; for your light has come, and the glory of the LORD has risen upon you. Congregation: For behold, darkness will cover the earth, and deep darkness the peoples; but the LORD will rise upon you.



CONSECRATION: SCRIPTURE & TEACHING

The Lesson - Isaiah 2:1-5

Reader: The Word of the Lord. Congregation: Thanks be to God.

The First Psalm - *Luke 1:67-79: Song of Zechariah*, vv. 1-5 Congregation: Amen! (following the Psalm)

And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of the Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God, begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father; by whom all things were made; who, for us men, and for our salvation, came down from Heaven, and was incarnate by the Holy Ghost of the virgin, Mary, and was made man; and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate; He suffered and was buried; and the third day He rose again, according to the Scriptures; and ascended into Heaven, and sits on the right hand of the Father; and He shall come again, with glory, to judge both the living and the dead; whose kingdom shall have no end. And we believe in the Holy Ghost, the Lord, and Giver of Life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son; who with the Father and the Son together is worshiped and glorified; who spoke by the Prophets. 
