If you are tuning in to Cherry Creek, welcome and thank you for worshiping with us on this Sunday morning.

Why do we baptize infants? In the Old Covenant God made with Abraham, God saw fit to signify and seal His covenant of grace through circumcision, not only to those who professed faith in God, but to their children as well. Along with other passages of Scripture, Colossians 2:11-12 teaches us that as the covenant of grace came to fruition in Christ, baptism replaced circumcision as the sign and seal of that covenant. We do not believe that baptism saves. Salvation is by grace alone, through faith alone, in Christ alone. But we do believe it is a sacrament that "signifies and seals our ingrafting into Christ...and our engagement to be the Lord's" (*Westminster* Shorter Catechism, 94).

How we participate in the bap-

tism of others. One of the reasons that baptism is performed as an element of our corporate worship rather than in a private ceremony is because Scripture tells us that part of baptism's significance is its marking of our entrance into the church—the body of Christ, God's people (1 Cor 12:13). We worship as we witness baptisms because we say in our heart to those baptized, "Welcome to our family." In fact, our witness to baptism goes beyond wel-
