If you are tuning in to Cherry Creek, welcome and thank you for worshiping with us on this Sunday morning.

Gloria in Excelsis Deo "Gloria in excelsis Deo" is a Latin phrase which means, "Glory to God in the highest." The reason we sing in Latin, at times, is because it connects us with the historic church. Soon after the time of Jesus, Latin became the overwhelmingly dominant common language of the Western world, and for that reason, much of early church history is rooted in that language. As we sing "Gloria in excelsis Deo," we remember that we are part of a story and plan far greater than our local context here in Denver.

The Sung Prayer for Illumination:

This prayer (from "O Come O Come, Emmanuel") asks that the words we read and subsequently unfold in preaching may truly be the Word for the community assembled, and for the healing and joy of the world, and that we might have insight into the wisdom and high demand of this Word...The wisdom of God's Word is different from human wisdom, and therefore it's hard for finite hearts and 'common sense' to grasp it. Therefore we pray for illumination to "see" this hard-to-see-wisdom...But knowing stuff about the Bible is not the only way to know the Bible. It could even be a deceptive and injurious way if it leads us to think of Scripture as a nut to be cracked by brain power instead of as revelation, an illuminating, graced, and
