Week	Bible Story	Summary
1	Ruth, Naomi, and Boaz	Naomi's husband and two sons died, so she decided to go back to her home in Bethlehem. Ruth, one of her daughters-in-law, goes with her, and Ruth and Naomi take care of each other. Ruth picks grain in a field that belongs to a man named Boaz, and Boaz decides to take care of Ruth and Naomi. God gives us people to call family, and we can thank God for family. <u>Who can I thank for everything? I can thank God for everything.</u>
2	Daniel's Friends Pray	Daniel and his friends Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego work for King Nebuchadnezzar. The king wants his wise men to help him understand a dream he had. But how were the wise men supposed to know what the king dreamed and what the dream meant? Daniel knew that only God could help so he asks his friends to pray. And they do! God answers their prayers and shows Daniel how to help the king. God gave Daniel really good friends who prayed for him. <u>Who can I thank for everything? I can thank God for everything.</u>
3	Manna and Quail	God's people, the Israelites, have been walking in a hot desert for a long time, and they are very hungry because they don't have any food. God knows that the Israelites need food. God loves His people and wants to take care of them. So, God gives the Israelites food to eat! God sends meat at night and bread in the morning, and there is more than enough food for everyone. We can thank God for the food we eat. <u>Who can I thank for everything? I can thank God for everything.</u>
4	Elisha's Room*	Elisha is a prophet which means Elisha tells people messages from God. In one town, there is a woman who wants to help Elisha. So, when Elisha is in her town, the woman and her husband have Elisha eat dinner at their house. One day, the woman tells her husband she wants to help Elisha even more. So, they make a room on the roof of their house so Elisha has a place to rest when he comes to their town. We can thank God for the people who help us. <u>Who can I thank for everything? I can thank God for everything.</u>
5	David Praises God	David loves God, and he praises God to show God he is thankful for everything. Praising God is thanking God for who He is and what He has done. David is so thankful to God that he dances with all his might to the sound of trumpets! David uses his voice to praise God and makes music with instruments to praise God! Praising God is celebrating God—like a HUGE thank you! <u>Who can I thank for everything? I can thank God for everything.</u>

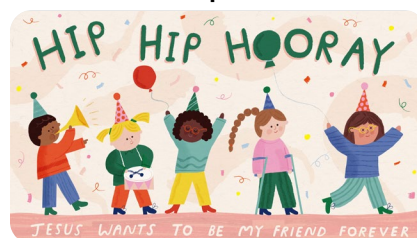

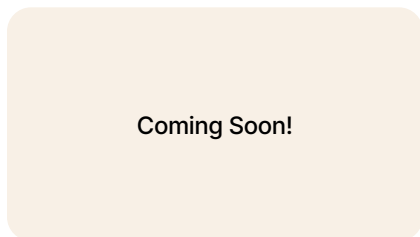

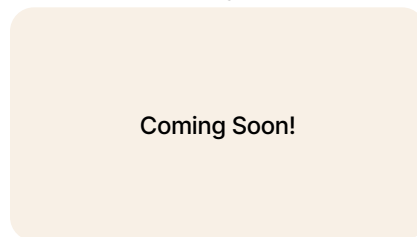

Social 15 minutes Providing time for fun interaction	Includes activities as preschoolers arrive. This time encourages preschoolers to enter the classroom and engage with peers and Small Group Leaders by providing fun, age-appropriate, hands-on activities that introduce new concepts they will hear in the Bible Story.	→ Plan for as many of the activities as possible. → Review the Small Group document for props and supplies needed.
Worship 10 minutes Inviting preschoolers to respond to God	We recommend worship songs that amplify teaching content for the month. We've created these songs to be developmentally appropriate, incorporating simple, direct language, fun dance movements, and upbeat, current arrangements. Songs are preloaded into APlay and available for purchase at store.thinkorange.com .	→ Recommendation: Have a Worship Leader and live instruments to sing along with the music tracks. → Encourage small group leaders to model what it means to worship by participating in worship using words and motions and encourage children to follow along. → Share music links with parents so they can stream them at home or in the car.
Story 10 minutes Communicating God's truth in engaging ways	Includes various methods of storytelling to engage every kid as they learn about God's Big Story and the part they can play in it. This time encourages kids to be active participants in their faith and not just bystanders.	→ Choose an engaging adult to tell the Bible Story. This person should be able to command the attention of preschoolers through animated storytelling. These scripts are written to be "told" and not "read." Advance preparation is necessary.
Groups 25 minutes Creating a safe place to connect	Includes activities written to reach every learning style. These activities will reinforce the Bottom Line introduced during the Bible Story and help kids apply it to real-life experiences.	→ Plan for as many of the activities as possible. → Review the Small Group document for props and supplies needed. → You may want to lead one activity at a time. Or offer two activities at once and allow half the children to participate in each. Then switch groups and repeat the activities.

Activity Stamps help you create intentional moments that meet kids where they are developmentally, emotionally, and spiritually.

Whether kids are moving, creating, building, sharing, or imagining, each stamp shows how the activity is designed to help kids engage with God's Word in a way that sticks. They also ensure variety and balance in your time together.

How to Use

So as you plan, try mixing it up! You'll see an assigned Activity Stamp listed with each activity to show you how it's designed to engage kids best.

One week you might do a "Made to Move" activity, and the next week might be "Made to Create." Both help kids connect with God in meaningful ways.

Using a variety of stamps throughout your time helps every kid feel seen and gives them a chance to connect with God's Word in a way that makes sense to them.

Create the Environment

General Tips

Declutter your environment.

While the relationships are what matter, a cluttered space is less inviting.

Store toys out of sight and out of mind.

It is difficult to engage a preschooler when their favorite toy is nearby.

If you share space with a preschool, develop a strong relationship with the preschool and preschool teachers.

Don't let space become a source of contention. If possible, work together to sew fitted covers for toy shelves that slip over the top of the shelf. (Think BBQ grill covers.) Choose fabric in neutral colors or match the wall color so the covered shelves blend into the background. Ask the preschool to cover everything before they leave on Friday, and ask your volunteers to uncover everything before leaving on Sunday. Set each other up for success.

Display the Theme Art, Bottom Line, or Memory Verse in photo frames at check-in so parents know what their child is learning.

Each month the Environment Art has printable elements from the theme art to help you extend the theme throughout your environment.

Tips for This Month

Use these ideas as starting point to bring the theme to life in your space.

Going on a Picnic

- Pull out those plush animals and play food and set up a picnic.
- Trees like in our theme art can be easily recreated with simple butcher paper and simple paint strokes (straight, thick, fuzzy, curved, and curly).
- Display pictures of people and things that we can be thankful for.

Create the Environment

December → Christmas Shapes

Check the theme art for our Christmas shapes that help tell the story. The heart-shaped angel comes with a message of love: that God is sending His Son Jesus. The square present represents that Jesus is the best gift of all. The circle sheep remind us that humble shepherds shared the story of Jesus' birth with everyone. Then the star appeared to lead the wise men to a young Jesus so they could worship Him. In addition to the Environment Art, there will be Nativity art in the Christmas Extras folder that you can use to decorate.

January → Book Fair

Preschoolers will read a lot of books, but the Bible is special because it teaches us the best things. Decorate with life-size books. You can even print the Story Images to go inside these books to help preschoolers see the wonderful story God tells us of His love for us.

February → Sweet Treats

Nothing is sweeter than Jesus' love! Create life-size lollipops and large candies and cakes with pool noodles, and don't forget to add some hearts and the Bottom Line.

March → All Star

March is all about Jesus' miracles because Jesus is amazing! Decorate with trophies with Jesus' name on them and props that represent the miracles. Consider changing to your April decorations a week early for Palm Sunday (the last week of March) to make Holy Week a little easier.

April → Hip Hip Hooray

Decorate for a party to celebrate Jesus and what He has done for us. Latex balloons are a serious choking hazard so decorate with mylar balloons by inflating them with air and taping them to the wall. Hang streamers and colorful bunting. Use the Easter Extras art to create an empty tomb.

May → Hats Off

We love our community helpers because they care for their community, and we want preschoolers to know that Jesus cares about EVERYONE! Consider taking pictures of your families, people from your church, and buildings in your community (schools, grocery store, library, etc.). Display those pictures in hearts to help your preschoolers see that Jesus cares for everyone. And don't forget you can decorate with community helper hats using the Environment Art.

Statement of Faith

About God

There is one, and only one, living and true God, existing in three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. God is just, powerful, good, and holy. God is infinite in love. Through love, God creates, sustains, suffers, judges, rescues, liberates, redeems, reconciles, and reigns.

About Jesus

God became human in Jesus of Nazareth. Jesus was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended to the dead, and on the third day He rose again. He ascended into heaven, and will come again to judge the living and the dead. The death and resurrection of Jesus offers redemption for humanity and the world.

About The Holy Spirit

The Holy Spirit is the third person of the Trinity, the fully divine Spirit of God, whose present activity is to guide, to convict, to comfort, to transform, and to strengthen. The Spirit bestows gifts, and cultivates the character and mind of Christ in believers for use in and through the Church.

About The Bible

The Holy Scripture was written under the divine inspiration of the Holy Spirit. It is accurate, reliable, and authoritative. It is the primary authority for all Christian faith and practice. The Scripture reveals the character of God, the nature of humanity, and the primacy of Jesus.

About Salvation

Jesus, being fully God and fully human, was born, lived, died, and rose again. It is only through Christ Jesus that humanity can find complete forgiveness, reconciliation, and wholeness.
