## The Bible is for Me | Made to Create

### What You Need

	"The Bible is for Me" Activity Page	1
	"The Bible is for Label" Activity Page	1

### What You Do:

*Before the Activity:* Copy "The Bible is for Me" on copy paper, one per child. Copy "The Bible is for Me Label" on label paper, one label per child. Cut construction paper into 4 ½-inch by 12-inch strips and fold in half, one per child. Fold each "The Bible is for Me" and insert into folded piece of construction paper. Staple at the center with the closure along the inside, and place a piece of tape over the staple bend. Write each child's name on their book.

*During the Activity:* Encourage children to add their label to the front of their book. Ask children to open their book and color and add to each page.

*After the Activity:* Connect the Bottom Line to the Bible Story.

### What You Say:

*Before the Activity:* "Come sit with me at the table. Let's make our own story picture Bible."

*During the Activity:* "On the front of your book, I want you to add this label. It says Bible. (Pause.) Great! Now open up, and on the first page, it says, God made me. Draw a picture of yourself on this page. (Pause.) Your pictures look so great! Turn the page, this page says God loves me. Put your big heart sticker on this page. (Pause.) This next page has a picture of Jesus on it. This page says Jesus wants to be my friend forever. That makes me happy, so let's add smiley faces to this page. (Pause.) Okay, turn to the last page. This page says the Bible is for ME! Decorate this page. (Pause.) Great job, friends!"

*After the Activity:* "We can live for God by drawing a picture to cheer up a friend. We can tell people about God. We can share food with other people. We can love like Jesus every day and everywhere we go! Isn't that the best? The Bible has God's words in it, and it teaches us the BEST things! **What does the Bible teach you? [Bottom Line] The Bible teaches me the best things.**"
