1 What You Do

Before the Activity

1. Gather children on one side of an open area in the room

During the Activity

- 2. Encourage children to run from one side of the room and time their runs.
- 3. Repeat as desired.

After the Activity

Introduce the Bible Story.

② What You Say

Before the Activity

"Everyone, come over here and let's get ready for a fun run!"

During the Activity

"I love to run fast, do you? Let's see how fast you can run from where you are right here (walk to the opposite side of the room) to where I am now and I'll time you. Ready, set, go! Run to me! (Start the timer.) Whoa! You are super-fast. The time says you ran [time] seconds! Stay here and I'll go stand on the other side and you can run again! (Repeat as desired.)
Great job running."

After the Activity

"That was so fun. In our Bible Story today, we're going to learn about a group of people who ran to see Jesus. I'm ready for the Bible Story, are you? Let's Go!"

Transition → Move to Worship and Story by slow running to your designated area.

Inclusive Pro Tips



If children cannot run, suggest all children run with their fingers or move in different ways, still explaining that people in our story "ran" to see Jesus.

Provide candy canes that are large enough to touch the ground so children can participate while sitting in a chair.

1 What You Do

Before the Activity

- 1. Scatter the cotton balls/pom-poms around the table.
- 2. Option: Copy "Allergy Alert Poster" on cardstock, list candy canes, and post at the door.

During the Activity

- Give each child a candy cane or if you have more children than candy canes, encourage children to gather two sheep then pass the candy cane to another child and repeat until each child has a turn.
- 2. Encourage children to pretend to be a shepherd and use the candy cane as a "staff" to gather the "sheep."
- 3. Gather all the sheep into the center of the table.

After the Activity

Introduce the Bible Story.

② What You Say

Before the Activity

"Friends, join me over here at the table. Look at all these cotton balls. Let's pretend they're sheep and we are shepherds. Shepherds have staffs that help direct and gather their sheep. (Hold up candy cane.) This candy cane looks a lot like a shepherd staff. We'll use these as our staffs to gather sheep."

During the Activity

"Okay, shepherds! Let's gather the sheep. Be gentle and kind and try to get your sheep in the middle of the table. (Pause.) Wow, you are good shepherds! Some of those sheep are tricky. Keep trying to gather them with your staff. (Once the sheep are gathered, scatter again. Repeat as desired.) That was so fun! You did a great job of being shepherds!"

After the Activity

"Today, in our Bible Story, we're going to hear about real shepherds who got some amazing news while they were in the field taking care of their sheep. Let's go hear our story!"

Transition → Move to Worship and Story by pretending to gather sheep as you walk to your designated area.

Offer and open-top version for children who may be anxious about putting hands inside a box.

(1) What You Do

Before the Activity

- 1. Cut armholes in the sides of a large cardboard box (big enough for preschoolers to stand behind and reach through).
- 2. Place the box on a small table or flat surface with blocks nearby.
- Build a simple shape such as a heart, a present, a sheep and a star using a few DUPLO bricks and place it inside the box so a child can reach in without seeing.

During the Activity

- 1. Invite one child at a time to stand behind the box and reach their arms through the holes in the side of the box.
- 2. Encourage children to feel the hidden shape inside the box using their hands.
- Once they have explored it, ask them to try to build a matching structure using the same type of DUPLO bricks outside the box.
- 4. They can check if their version matches once they are done.

After the Activity

Introduce the Bible Story.

What You Say

Before the Activity

"This is our build what you feel box! Inside, there's a special shape made from blocks. You'll reach inside, feel the shape, and then build your own version of it outside the box. But no peeking! Just use your hands to feel the shape!"

During the Activity

"[Child's name], stand behind the box and reach your arms inside. (Pause.) There's a shape inside the box. What do you feel? (Pause.) How many bricks do you feel? (Pause.) Are they going up? Across? Do you feel any corners or bumps? (Pause.) Now, use your own bricks to try building the same thing! (Pause.) Great job. Let's look at your blocks next to the one in the box. (Pause.) You did a good job making what you felt in the box. (Continue with each child.) You did a wonderful job guessing and building all the special shapes!"

After the Activity

"The circle shape reminds me of a sheep. Today we're going to hear a true story from the Bible about the time some shepherds ran to see Jesus. Let's get ready to hear the Bible Story!"

Transition → Move to Worship and Story by asking children to pretend to build a heart, a square, a circle, and a star.

② What You Say

Before the Activity

"Friends, come over here. Let's say our verse as we do the motions together. Ready? 'God (flat hand with thumb to forehead, pull down) loved the world so much (cross arms over chest) that he gave his only Son,' (rock arms like a baby) John 3:16. (Open hands like a book.) Fantastic!"

During the Activity

"I love our Memory Verse; it tells us that God loves us. Let's say it super-duper loud this time. 'God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son,' John 3:16. That was so loud! This time let's say it super soft. 'God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son,' John 3:16. Let's try to say it like a baby. (Pause.) Oh, that was funny. Now let's say our verse like a sheep. (Pause.) Yes, baaa, baaa that was so good baaa, baaa. I loved saying our verse in all the different ways and remembering that God loves us."

After the Activity

"Today in our Bible Story, the shepherds ran (run in place) to find Baby Jesus. They knew Baby Jesus was the best gift ever. How do we know that God loves us? [Bottom Line] God gave us Jesus!"

② What You Say

Before the Activity

"Who wants to play a puzzle game? I have three puzzles for us to put together. I can't wait to see what pictures they make!"

During the Activity

"Let's look at puzzle number one. (Put the puzzle together.) What do you see? (Pause for responses.) You're right! There's an angel (point) and some shepherds (point) and some sheep! (Point.) God sent an angel to tell shepherds the good news that Jesus had been born!

"Now let's look at puzzle number two. (Put the puzzle together.) What do you see? (Pause for responses.) Yes! I see shepherds running! After the angel told the shepherds Jesus had been born, they were so excited that they ran to see baby Jesus!

"We have one more puzzle to look at, puzzle number three. (*Put the puzzle together.*) What do you see? (*Pause for responses.*) Aww...it's baby Jesus. The shepherds found baby Jesus lying in a manger, just like the angel said they would."

After the Activity

"I love puzzles. But do you know who I love more than puzzles? (Pause.) I love Jesus! And I'm so glad God loved us so much that [Bottom Line] God gave us Jesus. How do we know God loves us? [Bottom Line] God gave us Jesus! Yay! [Bottom Line] God gave us Jesus!"

No, that wasn't in the story. Let's try again. (Reach in, pull a card out, and show it to the children.) Was this in our story? (Pause.) Yes, [picture] was in our story, great job! (Continue with all the items.) That was so fun. You found the shepherds and their sheep, the angels, Mary and Joseph, and baby Jesus."

After the Activity

"I love this true story from the Bible, because it reminds me of how much God loves me. Friends, how do we know God loves us? **[Bottom Line]** God gave us Jesus"

1 What You Do

Before the Activity

- 1. Pair children in groups of two.
- 2. Assign each pair a "sheep" balloon.
- 3. Insert the straw in the opening of the balloons and inflate with air.
- 4. Draw simple sheep faces on each mylar balloon.

During the Activity

- Model and encourage each pair to face each other, stretch their arms straight out in front of them and lock their forearms with their partner.
- 2. This will create a safe "pasture" for catching sheep.
- 3. Once all pairs are ready, a leader will toss a "sheep" balloon into the air above the pairs.
- 4. Their job is to catch the sheep using only their locked arms, not their hands.
- 5. Once caught, the sheep can be gently tossed back to the leader for another round.
- 6. Repeat as desired.

During the Activity

"Let's play a fun game where we pretend to be shepherds watching our sheep! You'll work with a friend to gently guide the balloon, our sheep, so it doesn't get away. Are you ready, shepherds? Lock your arms with your partner and get ready to catch the sheep. (Toss the sheep in the air over each of the groups.) You're doing a great job keeping your sheep safe! Keep working together just like the shepherds worked to take care of their sheep. Great teamwork!" (Repeat as desired.)

After the Activity

"In our story today, the shepherds were watching over their sheep when they heard the good news that Jesus was born. They were so excited that they ran to find Jesus and told everyone that Jesus was born! God loves us so much that [Bottom Line] God gave us Jesus! How do we know God loves us? [Bottom Line] God gave us Jesus."

② What You Say

Before the Activity

"Come to the table and let's create a super special Christmas ornament."

During the Activity

"We're going to make an ornament today that has a circle shape. This fun ornament will help us remember the part of the true Christmas story when the shepherds ran to see Jesus. Color your picture. (Pause.) I see Mary, Joseph, baby Jesus, and the shepherds. What animal do shepherds take care of? (Pause.) Sheep! That's right! These little pom-poms look like sheep. Let's count out three sheep. One, two, three! Great job! Put those to the side and we'll add them later. Trace the circle (point) with the glue. (Pause.) Put those sheep inside the circle, and now I'll help you add this circle on top of the glue. (Position a half of the ornament on top of the glue.) We'll let these super cute circle ornaments dry and then you can take them home."

After the Activity

"Today's true story from the Bible begins with some shepherds who were out in a field taking care of their sheep. One night, God sent an angel to give the shepherds a message. The angel said, "Don't be afraid! I bring you good news of great joy! God's Son, Jesus, has been born! Then more angels came and praised God and said: "Glory to God in the highest!" (Luke 2:14 NIV) The shepherds were so excited, they ran and found baby Jesus in a manger just like the angel had said. They were so happy the shepherds told EVERYONE that Jesus, God's Son, was born! Everyone who heard the good news about Jesus was amazed. The shepherds praised God because [Bottom Line] God gave us Jesus! How do we know God loves us? [Bottom Line] God gave us Jesus!"

During the Activity

(Open the Bible and lay it in front of the children.) "In our Bible Story today, the shepherds were so excited about Jesus being born that they didn't walk...they didn't jog...they RAN to see baby Jesus!

"When the shepherds got to Mary and Joseph, they saw Jesus lying in a manger, just like the angel said. It was true! 'God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son!' John 3:16

"Hey! That's the Bible verse we are learning! 'God (flat hand with thumb to forehead, pull down) loved the world so much (cross arms over chest) that he gave his only Son,' (rock arms like a baby) John 3:16. (Open hands like a book.) Let's say that together! Just stand up and say what I say and do what I do! 'God (flat hand with thumb to forehead, pull down) loved the world so much (cross arms over chest) that he gave his only Son,' (rock arms like a baby) John 3:16. (Open hands like a book.)

"Wow! That was fantastic! (*Two thumbs up.*) Now let's sit down so we can write in our prayer journal and talk to God. (*Open journal.*) In our Bible Story, the shepherds ran to see baby Jesus, and they found Jesus lying in a manger, right where the angel said Jesus would be. I wonder what the shepherds said to baby Jesus.

"Hey! That gives me an idea! Let's write in our prayer journal what we would tell baby Jesus if we saw Him lying in a manger, like the shepherds did. Then we can use the list when we pray. When I say your name, tell me what you would tell baby Jesus if you saw Him lying in a manger, and I will write it in our journal. (Assist when needed. Remember to print, as you write in the journal, so the children can recognize their names and the letters.)

After the Activity

"This is so special! (Hold up journal.) Let's pray and talk to God. Would anyone like to pray before I pray? (Give each child who wants to pray the opportunity to do so.) Dear God, Thank You that we got to hear more about the true story of Christmas and how You gave us Your Son, Jesus. If we were like the shepherds and saw baby Jesus, [child's name] would tell Him (read what they wrote), and [child's name] would tell Him... (say this with each child). You're the best, God. In Jesus name. Amen."

- Insert the straw in the opening of the balloons and inflate with air.
- 2. Draw simple sheep faces on each mylar balloons.
