To have a Partnering Mindset is to remember: Parents are the primary spiritual influencers, and your role is to support, not replace them. Your role is to support, not replace them. Here's a practical breakdown of how to partner with parents in a way that's relational, consistent, and impactful.

## 1. Build Trusting Relationships

## Learn Names & Be Visible

OGreet them at drop-off/pick-up. Introduce yourself and remember their names.

#### **Celebrate Their Student**

Send a quick "just because" encouragement text

## **Create Margin for Parent Conversations**

- OBe approachable and accessible, not rushed or detached.
- Arrive early and stay after small groups for quick chats.

#### 2. Communicate Regularly & Clearly
