DAY 33: And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one



DAY 34: And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one

The man who believes that he is perfect can never pray the Lord's prayer; he must offer one of his own making, for he will never be willing to say, "Lead us not into temptation, but, beloved, because the devil thinks it's worth his while to tempt us, we may conclude that there is something in us that is temptable, - that sin still dwells there, notwithstanding that the grace of God has renewed our hearts – Charles Spurgeon

As Christians, we exist in this phase of life some call "already, not yet." We are already saved and justified from our old sinful ways, but we have not yet been glorified in heaven. As long as we exist on this earth, we will always wrestle against our flesh. The battle is won when we confess and recognize our sinfulness, give it to Christ, and seek to please and follow Him.

1 John 1:8 NIV

"If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us."

Ephesians 6:12 NIV

"For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the power of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms."

The enemy is constantly looking for one he can deceive and lead into evil. Christ is calling you to stand firm in the Gospel. Believe that Christ is who He says He is, and walk in a way that is worthy of the calling of Christians. Be strong, unwavering, and totally sold out for Jesus, and then you will have triumph over temptation.

Galatians 5:16 NIV

So I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh.

As you pray today, ask the Lord to reveal what He needs for you to be completely bought into the Gospel.

DAY 35: And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one

Temptation is "The lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, the pride of life. (1 John 2:16) Every temptation that you face is a component of one of these. – Adrian Rogers

As we discussed yesterday, God's Word reminds us that we can be victorious over any temptation if we allow the Holy Spirit to direct our thoughts and actions. In His Word, we find examples of those who were confronted with temptation and overcame it. This is evidence that we, too, can resist and conquer it.

Jesus Himself is our perfect example of overcoming temptation.

Matthew 4:1 NIV

Then Jesus was led by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil.

Hebrews 4:15 NIV

For we do not have a high priest who is unable to empathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are – yet he did not sin.

2 Timothy 2:22 NIV

"Flee the evil desires of youth and pursue righteousness, faith, love, and peace, along with those who call on the Lord out of a pure heart."

James 4:7 ESV

Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you.



When Scripture tells us to flee, that does not mean stand and fight temptation, but genuinely flee, leave the scene, remove yourself from the situation causing this temptation. Know that through Christ we can overcome any temptation as long as we are continually putting our trust and faith in Christ.

DAY 36: And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one.

As long as we have breath, temptation will be a part of our lives. It often occurs when we least expect it – when we are drawing closer to God, stepping into our calling, or breaking free from strongholds. These are when the attacks tend to intensify. But here's the truth: the closer we walk with God, the more alert we become to the battle between the flesh and the Spirit. Instead of being caught off guard, we are strengthened by His presence and equipped through His Word.

James 1:3 NIV

"because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance."

James 1:12 NIV

"Blessed is the one who perseveres under trial because, having stood the test, that person will receive the crown of life that the Lord has promised to those who love him."

We are to stand firm in the Lord so that we are not swayed from the Truth and carried away by our fleshly desires.

Every trial endured, every temptation squashed, and everything that has happened serve as stepping stones to being made more like Christ. As we push forward through the difficult times and stand firm on the Rock of Jesus, have hope that God will mold you into the Christian He desires you to be.

Romans 5:2-5 NIV

"Not only so, but we also glory in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope. And hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us."

Depend on God, for He is dependable. Stand firm in the power of the Gospel. Sin has no hold over us who have died to it and have been raised with Christ.

"When you sleep, remember that you are resting on the battlefield; when you travel, suspect an ambush in every hedge." - Charles Spurgeon



1 Peter 5:8 NIV

Be alert and of sober mind. Your enemy, the devil, prowls around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour.

John 10:10a NIV

The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy.



Spiritual warfare's goal is to stop you from becoming who God has created you to be or to hinder your advancement of the Kingdom. It is a distraction. We must never forget that the enemy we are fighting is not our spouse, our family member, our coworker, or our neighbor.

Ephesians 6:10-13 ESV

Finally, be strong in the Lord and the strength of his might. Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil. For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. Therefore, take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand firm.

We are so thankful for a Savior who is ready, willing, and able to protect us from the evil one. Our battle, as stated in Matthew, is against the evil one. But Christ is triumphant, now and forever. Place your feet on the solid rock that is Christ Jesus, and He is faithful to deliver you.

As you pray today, pray that the Lord becomes the only thing that draws your attention and that through Him, sin would have no hold over us any longer.

Matthew 15:19 NIV

Galatians 6:7-9 NIV

Do not be deceived: God cannot be mocked. A man reaps what he sows. Whoever sows to please their flesh, from the flesh will reap destruction; whoever sows to please the Spirit, from the Spirit will reap eternal life. Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up.

We must allow the Holy Spirit to have complete control of our thoughts and actions. We are to take captive any thoughts that enter our minds and make them obedient to Christ.

2 Corinthians 10:5b NIV

And we take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ.

Psalm 51:12 NIV

Luke 15:7 NIV

"I tell you that in the same way there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who do not need to repent."

Acts 3:19 NIV

"Repent then, and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out, that times of refreshing may come from the Lord."

Repentance is not meant to bring condemnation, but freedom. True restoration follows true repentance.

Romans 8:1-2 NIV

"Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus, because through Christ Jesus the law of the Spirit who gives life has set you free from the law of sin and death."

When we turn to Him with humble, repentant hearts, God not only forgives but also renews us. Just like the prodigal son who returned home expecting rejection but received a celebration, we are welcomed back with open arms full of love when we return to our Heavenly Father.

As you pray today, lay down your shame, sin, burdens, and everything in between and be renewed by the power of the Gospel.
