THE "I" IN HIM IS MY COMPLETENESS

It's in Jesus that I have everything I need for life, liberty and success.

KEY POINTS

- ❖ Scholars believe that Paul's letter to the Colossians believers was to address false teachings such as Jewish legalism, Greek philosophy, and mysticism that had apparently infiltrated their church. In addition to refuting these doctrines. Paul used the letter to reaffirm Christ's supremacy and sufficiency in every area of life.
- ❖ The teachings Paul contested, like mysticism (or spirituality), focused on the exultation of the individual and emphasized the individual's journey of self-discovery and inner transformation to achieve enlightenment. Rather than focusing on God, people pursued fulfillment though things like fame, fortune, power, influence, education, and relationships.
- ❖ The reality is that we as Christians must also contend with this philosophy in this day and age, where the world puts forth the idea that you are the authority of your own ultimate source and where themes like speaking "your truth" prevail.
- ❖ To counter the false teachings infiltrating the church, Paul redirected the saints' attention from self-centeredness to focus Jesus—the One in whom we are made complete.
- ❖ The Cambridge dictionary defines 'completeness' as "the quality of being whole or perfect and having nothing missing."
- ❖ In Colossians 2:10, the Greek word plēroō is used for 'complete', which means "to fulfill, make full; to be filled."
- We are complete in Jesus. In Jesus we are whole, perfect—we lack nothing in Him!
- ❖ To understand what it means to experience true completeness, we must recognize the supremacy of Jesus. Paul does this in Colossians 1 by emphasizing the unique nature of Jesus Christ as the perfect representation of God when he tells those of the Colossian church that "the Son is the image of the invisible God" (v.v. 15-16).
- ❖ The term, 'image' implies a likeness or representation. Jesus, who embodies the fullness of God, making the invisible God known to humanity by serving as the visible manifestation of God's character and essence (see Hebrews 1:3).
- The completeness and totality of the deity (Theos = God) is in Jesus. Everything necessary for salvation and spiritual life is found in Christ alone.
- ❖ Jesus was not merely a man; He was also the expression of the full divine nature and essence of God in human form. It's no wonder Paul proclaims, "Great is the mystery of godliness!" in 1 Timothy 3 (v.v. 15-16).

KEY SCRIPTURE: Colossians 2:9-10 (all scripture in NIV unless otherwise noted)

- The Greek word Paul uses for 'mystery' in 1 Timothy 3 is musterion, which has the meaning "mystery, secret; something that is now unveiled, a secret, which would remain such, except for revelation."
- ❖ The musterion (mystery) that is God was revealed in the flesh. This is why Paul emphasises the supremacy of Jesus over all other doctrines and philosophies—He is the revelation of God to us!
- ❖ Paul also uses the term *musterion* in Colossians 1. saying, "To them God has chosen to make known among the Gentiles the glorious riches of this mystery, which is Christ in you, the hope of glory" (v.v. 25-27).
- The musterion (mystery) is that Christ is in you. God, the hope of Glory, is in you!
- ❖ If you have accepted Jesus as your personal Lord and Saviour and have been filled with His Spirit, God lives in you "...and in Him," Colossians 2:10 (NASB) declares, you have been made complete."
- ❖ Our spiritual fullness and sufficiency is in Christ. As believers, we have everything we need in Jesus to thrive in our relationship with God.
- ❖ Jesus said that if we remain in Him and His words remains in us, we will be fruitful or complete (see John 15: 5. 7).
- ❖ In Jesus, we are whole. We are perfect. We are missing nothing. We are complete in Him!

DISCUSSION/REFLECTION TOOLS

1 Timothy 3:16 speaks of the musterion (mystery) of godliness: "And without controversy great is the mystery of godliness: God was manifest in the flesh. justified in the Spirit, seen of angels, preached unto the Gentiles, believed on in the world, received up into glory."

Paul then further lays out the *musterion* (mystery) that is God in Colossians 1:25-27, saying, "...Which is Christ in you, the hope of glory."

- Discuss the *musterion* of godliness as laid out in 1 Tim. 3:16 and how it has impacted the world in a general sense.
- 2. Referring to Col. 1:25-27, how have you been personally impacted by the *musterion* of godliness?
- 3. How has the "I" in Him become your completeness (has made you whole) in your everyday life?



GOD

We believe there is only one God: the eternal, holy, loving, all-knowing, all-powerful, omnipresent Spirit, creator of all (Deuteronomy 6:4; 1 Timothy 1:17; Leviticus 19:2; 1 John 4:8; Hebrews 4:13; Revelation 19:6; Jeremiah 23:24; John 4:24; Isaiah 44:24; Colossians 1:16).

GOD'S WORD

We believe the Holy Scriptures—The Bible—is God's true and complete Word to humanity, verified most notably through fulfilled prophecies concerning Jesus Christ (2 Timothy 3:16; 2 Peter 1:20-21; Isaiah 41:21-23, 42:8-9, 46:9-10; Luke 24:25-27; John 17:17).

GOD'S CREATION

Faith is sparked within us when we hear the gospel, the "good news" that Jesus died, was buried and rose from the dead for our benefit (Romans 10:14-17; 1 Corinthians 15:1-4).

OUR FAITH RESPONSE

Hearing the gospel is intended to lead us to repentance, a divinely inspired change of heart that causes us to turn away from our sins and turn to God (2 Corinthians 7:9-10; 2 Timothy 2:24-26). Faith and repentance lead us to obey the scriptural command to be baptized in Jesus' name for the forgiveness of our sins and to receive His gift of the Holy Spirit. His Spirit gives us the power to live a righteous, godly life, joyfully sharing the good news of our new life in Christ with others (Mark 16:16; Acts 2:38, 4:12; 1 Peter 1:22-23).

CHRIST'S RETURN

We believe our Lord Jesus Christ will soon return to Earth to receive His people to Himself and establish His righteous, eternal kingdom (John 14:3; Matthew 25:34).
