THE EVANGELIST

The Spirit anoints the evangelist to GATHER unbelievers by sharing the gospel with them so they may be saved.

KEY POINTS

- A simplistic definition of the five-fold ministry is the following: Apostles GO; Prophets GUIDE; <u>Evangelists GATHER</u>; Pastors GROW; and Teachers GROUND.
- According to Peter Wagner, the gift of evangelism is "to share the gospel with unbelievers in such a way that men and women become Jesus' disciples and responsible members of the Body of Christ." The evangelist's main role is to bring the unsaved into the Church.

The Spirit anointed Philip to reach out to the Ethiopian eunuch.

- Of the various aspects of the five-fold ministry, the office of the evangelist is the one that relies most on the vessel being deeply in tune with the Spirit.
- With the other four gifts or offices, the vessel has a level of knowledge of their general audience. For the evangelist, however, there tends to be more reliance on hearing directly from the Spirit because they often have less experience with their audience.
- "Now an angel of the Lord said to Philip, 'Go south to the road—the desert road—that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza'" (Acts 8:26).
- Whether the instruction was out of his way or contrary to his plans, Philip immediately obeyed the voice of the Spirit and went. And on the way, he noticed an important official, an Ethiopian eunuch. It was then that "the Spirit told Philip, 'Go to that chariot and stay near it" (v. 29).
- Philip trusted the voice of the Spirit and his obedience opened up a powerful opportunity.

Philip preached the gospel to the Ethiopian eunuch.

- Philip "heard the man reading Isaiah the prophet. 'Do you understand what you are reading?' '...How can I,' he said, 'unless someone explains it to me?'" (Acts 8:30-31).
- God knows that you need to get close to the people He's calling in order for you to know who and where they are. In his engagement of the eunuch, Philip started where the eunuch was and not where he was. The eunuch was reading Isaiah, so Philip engaged him with what his current interest was and not with what Philip was interested in telling him. It was that appeal that caused the eunuch to invite Philip to join him
- ❖ The eunuch then asked a seemingly simple question: "Tell me, please, who is the prophet talking about, himself or someone else?" (v. 34).
- The answer could have been short—that the prophet was talking about the promised Messiah and not himself—yet Philip used the question as an opening to preach the gospel. To the evangelist, every conversation is an opening to get to the sharing of the gospel.
- Look at Jesus with the Samaritan woman at the well. The conversation began with what she had, who she was, and what she needed. It ended with a two-day evangelistic experience for that town (see John 4).

KEY SCRIPTURE: Acts 8:26-40

(all scripture in NIV unless otherwise noted)

The emphasis of our evangelistic effort at Faith Sanctuary is to meet people where they are. Consistent with Jesus' statement that "the gates of hell shall not prevail against [the Church]" (Matt. 16:18 KJV), we are willing to go to where people are in sin in order to reach them for Jesus because He "came to seek and to save the lost" (Luke 19:10).

The Ethiopian eunuch was saved and gathered into the body of Christ.

Start-up: When you

- "Then Philip began with that very passage of Scripture and told him the good news about Jesus" (Acts 8:35).
- God has a wonderful plan for your life. But because of sin, humanity fell out of relationship with Him, and we can't restore that relationship ourselves. That's why He came in Jesus to save us from our sins, and the Bible tells us how to access His free gift of life (see Acts 2:38).
- The eunuch repented of his sins. In other words, he purposed to turn away from the life he was living and follow the way of the Lord. He confirmed that he had faith, that he believed in this gospel of salvation in Christ. With that in place, he could be baptized. And all this was taking place in the Presence of the Spirit of God, the same Spirit that would fill the eunuch to complete his salvation (Acts 8:37-38).
- A note to consider is that the evangelist didn't hang around to take the newly born saint to the next level. He went off to his next assignment. This is because the Spirit anoints the evangelist to GATHER unbelievers by sharing the gospel with them so they may be saved. Others of the five-fold ministry equip the discipleship journey of the saints.
- We should all be involved in personal evangelism and take the good news of salvation to those within our sphere of influence. Yet the gift of the evangelist is imparted to a select group of people who have this edge when it comes to sharing Jesus with a wide array of people.
- Christ has given the office and anointing of the evangelist for the equipping of the saints. We must urgently GATHER unbelievers by sharing the gospel with them so they may be saved.

DISCUSSION/REFLECTION TOOLS

- Have a look at Philip's encounter with the eunuch in Acts 8:26-40 and Jesus' interaction with the Samaritan woman in John 4. Discuss how the gift of evangelism was in operation in each instance and the impact of each encounter.
- 2. In what way can we engage with others and tell them about Christ in our daily lives?



GOD

Hearing the gospel is intended to lead us to repentance, a divinely inspired change of heart that causes us to turn away from our sins and turn to God (2 Corinthians 7:9-10; 2 Timothy 2:24-26). Faith and repentance lead us to obey the scriptural command to be baptized in Jesus' name for the forgiveness of our sins and to receive His gift of the Holy Spirit. His Spirit gives us the power to live a righteous, godly life, joyfully sharing the good news of our new life in Christ with others (Mark 16:16; Acts 2:38, 4:12; 1 Peter 1:22-23).

CHRIST'S RETURN

We believe our Lord Jesus Christ will soon return to Earth to receive His people to Himself and establish His righteous, eternal kingdom (John 14:3; Matthew 25:34).
