THE APOSTLE

The apostle is one who is sent by the church with the authority to GO and establish believers under the church's covering.

KEY POINTS

- A simplistic definition of the five-fold ministry is that Apostles Go, Prophets Guide, Evangelists Gather, Pastors Grow, and Teachers Ground.
- An apostle's key contribution is church growth and oversight. Their gift, as Peter Wagner defines it, "...enables them to assume and exercise helpful leadership over a number of churches in spiritual matters which is spontaneously recognized and appreciated by those churches."

The apostles in Jerusalem sent the apostles Paul and Barnabas to the church in Antioch.

- The apostles in Jerusalem were the original eleven chosen by Jesus, plus Matthias, who took the position Judas vacated. They were with Jesus from the beginning of His ministry and had seen the resurrected Christ. Each had been called by Jesus to be apostles, though one might say Matthias was chosen indirectly by the casting of lots. These twelve apostles were the foundation of the church (see Revelation 21:14).
- ❖ Paul and Barnabas were also called apostles (Acts 14:14), though Paul described himself as the apostle to the Gentiles (Romans 11:13). These two men were sent by the apostles in Jerusalem, who represented the foundation of the growing church that Jesus built upon the revelation He gave to Peter—that He is "the Messiah, the Son of the living God" (Matthew 16:16-17).
- ❖ The doctrine of salvation—that the way to Jesus is by grace through faith in Jesus and not by keeping the Jewish Law was essential to the foundation of the fast-growing church. Thus, the apostles in Jerusalem felt it necessary to send leaders out into the field to confirm their word.

Judas and Silas were sent to confirm the authority of the message Paul and Barnabas brought.

- Apostles go because they are sent. However, as we read in Acts 15:24, there were people who had gone out from among those in Jerusalem who wanted to impose the Jewish Law on others.
- ❖ These people went, but had not received authority from the apostles in Jerusalem. Their message became a stumbling block and not a blessing to the Gentile churches.
- The solution was for the apostles in Jerusalem to send the general apostles Paul and Barnabas—people who had the authority to speak on behalf of the church. (There is a difference between Jesus' twelve apostles and the apostles more generally referred to in the five-fold ministry.) These were men who had risked their lives for the name of Jesus (see 2 Corinthians 11:22-28).
- There is an element of the anointing of the apostle that has to do with being a credible witness. Just as Judas and Silas served as witnesses to the apostles' mission, so we have people here at Faith Sanctuary who carry a similar anointing that can calm and consolidate the many different segments of the body in order for the kingdom of

God to be further established and aligned behind the vision God gave us.

The apostles' letter confirmed the message of Paul's leadership in the churches.

- ❖ In matters of church leadership, the apostolic direction comes from God, just as Jesus said it should in John 14:26.
- What the apostles felt the Spirit was saying seemed to resonate with what they were feeling: that there was no need to burden the gentiles with the Jewish ceremonial laws. However, there were certain pertinent things they needed to pay attention to (Acts 15:29; see also 1 Cor. 8:8-9).
- * The sheep will follow the leadership of the apostle because they belong to God. Goats won't follow because they don't have the gift of the apostle and are unable to see things as God does. They think only about themselves and are willing to drag down the children for whom Christ died. "You will do well to avoid these things" (Acts 15:29).
- ❖ Paul had been preaching a gospel of salvation through faith in God by grace and not by works. Yet there were others who came from Jerusalem who taught a different gospel. To the new converts, they looked like the real deal, but what was missing was the apostolic anointing.
- ❖ More than that, they failed to grasp what the prophets had written and what Jesus had said about the New Covenant. That's why the apostles from Jerusalem confirmed the message they had sent with Paul and the delegation to Antioch.
- The things we are doing here at Faith Sanctuary can be backed up—confirmed—by the full counsel of scripture, which people with the apostolic anointing always refer to.
- The office of the apostle will grow as our church grows. As we do, some of you with the apostolic anointing will be sent to **GO** with authority to exercise leadership over a number of churches. It all starts with that gifting in operation in our church.

DISCUSSION/REFLECTION TOOLS

- Read Acts 15:24-27. Discuss these verses in the context that "Apostles go because they are sent." What happens when people go out who were never sent?
- 2. According to Scripture, what are some of the attributes of an apostle (e.g., Mark 3:14-15; 2 Cor. 12:12)?
- 3. "An apostle's key contribution is church growth and oversight." Discuss this statement as it relates to Faith Sanctuary.

FAITH FOUNDATIONS

We believe there is only one God: the eternal, holy, loving, allknowing, all-powerful, omnipresent Spirit, creator of all (Deuteronomy 6:4; 1 Timothy 1:17; Leviticus 19:2; 1 John 4:8; Hebrews 4:13; Revelation 19:6; Jeremiah 23:24; John 4:24; Isaiah 44:24; Colossians 1:16).

GOD'S WORD

We believe the Holy Scriptures—The Bible—is God's true and complete Word to humanity, verified most notably through fulfilled prophecies concerning Jesus Christ (2 Timothy 3:16; 2 Peter 1:20-21; Isaiah 41:21-23, 42:8-9, 46:9-10; Luke 24:25-27; John 17:17).

GOD'S CREATION

We believe all people were created in the image of God for His pleasure, to be His children, His church and His bride, living in eternal love and fellowship with Him (Revelation 4:1; Genesis 1:27; John 1:12-13; Romans 8:16; Ephesians 5:25-32; Revelation 19:7).

HUMANITY'S FALL

We acknowledge that we have all sinned and failed to fulfill God's plan and purpose for our lives, through willful disobedience to the word of God and our own conscience. All sinful acts lead to separation and alienation from God's pure. holy presence, eventually resulting in both physical and spiritual death (Romans 3:23, 6:23a).

THE GOSPEL

We believe that Jesus Christ is the Almighty God, fully divine and fully human (1 Timothy 3:16). He came to Earth and suffered death by crucifixion, willingly substituting Himself for us in receiving God's judgment against sin (Isaiah 53:5). But God raised Him from death (Acts 5:30), and He now offers eternal life to all who will believe in Him (John 3:14-17, 6:29; 2 Corinthians 5:18-21; Romans 6:23b; Ephesians 2:4-9). Faith is sparked within us when we hear the gospel, the "good news" that Jesus died, was buried and rose from the dead for our benefit (Romans 10:14-17; 1 Corinthians 15:1-4).

OUR FAITH RESPONSE

Hearing the gospel is intended to lead us to repentance, a divinely inspired change of heart that causes us to turn away from our sins and turn to God (2 Corinthians 7:9-10; 2 Timothy 2:24-26). Faith and repentance lead us to obey the scriptural command to be baptized in Jesus' name for the forgiveness of our sins and to receive His gift of the Holy Spirit. His Spirit gives us the power to live a righteous, godly life, joyfully sharing the good news of our new life in Christ with others (Mark 16:16; Acts 2:38, 4:12; 1 Peter 1:22-23).

CHRIST'S RETURN

We believe our Lord Jesus Christ will soon return to Earth to receive His people to Himself and establish His righteous, eternal kingdom (John 14:3; Matthew 25:34).
