IT'S TIME TO MOVE FORWARD

God is able to overcome any obstacle. So, let go of your fear, access your faith, and move forward.

KEY POINTS

- ❖ Equity versus equality. Equality is providing the same resources to everyone, irrespective of individual circumstance, while equity involves taking individual circumstances into account when providing resources.
- ❖ In the "equity vs equality" debate, an equitable approach leads to more successful outcomes. By understanding where a person comes from and tailoring resources and opportunities to them specifically, they can get farther in life.
- ❖ When we study the Scriptures, one of the things that becomes clear is that God often takes the equitable approach with humanity. God moves with specificity and with intention. He is not random or arbitrary in how He does
- With this in mind, Numbers 13 tells us of a critical moment for the nation of Israel. They had been traveling in the desert when the Lord told Moses to "send some men to explore the land of Canaan" (v.v. 1-2).
- The nation of Israel had been without a home and God had promised them one. Not only did God promise them a home, He promised to take them out of their misery and settle them in a rich land "flowing with milk and honey" (Exodus 3:17).
- When the Israelites went into the land, they found it to be exactly as God described: a rich, fruitful place, flowing with milk and honey. God was true to His Word!
- But then something odd happens—the leaders don't want to go. What?! Why not? "...The people who live there are powerful, and the cities are fortified and very large. We even saw descendants of Anak there" (Num. 13:28).
- And the leaders, operating in fear instead of hope, went so far as to insult themselves, saying they were "like grasshoppers in our own eves, and we looked the same to them" (v. 33).
- ❖ Can you imagine God's reaction as He watched all this unfold? It's easy to point out the foolishness of Israel, but what about our own mistakes?
- How many times have we acted in fear instead of in faith? How many times have we clung to what's familiar and let go of the future God has in store for us? And how many times have we called ourselves grasshoppers when we should have called ourselves giants?
- It got so bad with Israel that they wept and complained about Moses and Aaron. They thought it would have been better if they had died in the wilderness and "said to each other, 'We should...go back to Egypt'" (Num. 14:4).
- If they had been successful in their desire to return to Egypt, what would have happened to the rest of the Old Testament? What about the New Testament and the life of Jesus? They were risking more than they could have possibly imagined by going against what God wanted them to do.

KEY SCRIPTURE: Numbers 13:27-33

(all scripture in NIV unless otherwise noted)

- Fear of the future, fear of the unknown, fear of change will rob you of your destiny and leave you in chains. But "...God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound mind" (2 Timothy 1:7 NKJV).
- ❖ It's time to move forward. God has spoken. He has opened up a promise and an opportunity for you. Now is the time to let go of your fear and move forward.
- ❖ Do you remember BlackBerry? Once upon a time, it was the phone to have and had dominated the marketplace. Nobody at the time could have suspected that in just a few short years, BlackBerry would pretty much be forgotten in the smartphone landscape.
- ❖ Why did BlackBerry fail? An online search would provide these top two answers: "slow to embrace change" and "failure to innovate." BlackBerry didn't move forward and, today, it doesn't even operate in the marketplace it once defined.
- In Numbers 14, God does something terrifying. In the face of Israel's refusal to embrace change and failure to innovate, He skips an entire generation (v.v. 26-35).
- ❖ The crossing from Egypt to Canaan—from slavery to promise, from oppressed group to recognized nation—would have been about 10 days by foot.
- Israel's future could have been secured in a week and a half, but they went in circles for forty years because God refused to honour a generation that treated His Word and His promise with contempt.
- We're in a season of change and growth that is clearly instigated by God. There is obviously a trajectory the Lord has us on, but if we refuse to move forward in obedience with His Word and His promise, He will skip us. His plan will still be accomplished, but we won't be
- So, how do we make sure that doesn't happen? We let go of fear. We access faith. And we move forward.

DISCUSSION/REFLECTION TOOLS

- "God moves with specificity and with intention." Discuss this statement in relation to the Israelites' sojourn from Egypt to Canaan, from slavery to promise.
- Like the Israelites, name at least two other biblical figures who acted out of fear instead of faith. What happened when they acted out of fear? Were they eventually able to have a faith response? How so?
- 3. Has God ever moved with specificity and intention in vour life? Testify!

THE GOSPEL


