- 3. Do you believe that when we look for God, we will find God? Why or why not?
- 4. In Psalm 84:3a, the Psalmist writes, "Even the sparrow has found a home ..." Why did the Psalmist find hope in the birds building nests at the Temple?
- 5. What do we do when we're disappointed? Does God care about us as much as He cares about the birds (Job 12:7-10 & Matthew 6:26)? Explain.
- 6. What does it mean to "Be Open" to God, no matter what our circumstances?
- 7. In Psalm 84:3, the Psalmist writes, "Even the sparrow has found a home, and the swallow a nest for herself, where she may have her young a place near your altar, LORD Almighty, my King and my God." Why was the writer so taken by the care the mother bird gave her young?
- 8. What does it mean to make God's House our home?
- 9. Only 33% of adults in the US attend religious services once a month or more. Why is it so difficult for Americans to Be Available to God and attend church?
- 10. When we assemble together in God's Presence, there is peace and power. What should our attitudes be like when we come together at church?
- 11. In Psalm 84:3, the Psalmist writes, "Blessed are those who dwell in your house; they are ever praising you." What does it mean to be "ever praising God?" How do we accomplish this attitude?
- 12. The Psalmist outlines three distinct pictures in 84:4 Attendance Connection Testimony.
