- 2. Read Luke 18:18-21. Who is the young man in our story? Why is he called the "rich, young, ruler?" (Cross Reference Matthew 19:16-22 & Mark 10:17-22)
- 3. What preconceived ideas did the young man have about having a "perfect" relationship with God? Can we be perfect? Explain.
- 4. What did Jesus mean when He said that only God is good? Why do so many people think that being good is "good enough?"
- 5. In a recent Gallup Poll, 81% of people say they believe in God, but only 4 in 10 Americans believe that God can hear our prayers and intervene. Why do people believe this way? Do you?
- 6. In Luke 18:22-25 Jesus confronts the man's biggest obstacle. What was it? Why was this a problem?
- 7. What kinds of "sacred stuff" do people struggle with today? What would Jesus ask you to give up to really live?
- 8. What did Jesus mean when he talked about a camel and a needle? What was His point?
- 9. In Luke 18:26-30 we realize that Jesus' disciples were confused by His analogy? Why?
- 10. Who can be saved? Are all things possible with God? Who do you know that needs Jesus?
- 11. What impossible thing does God want you to give over to Him so you can truly Give to Live?
