

Text: Jonah 3:1-10

- 1. What does the word "compassion" mean to you? When have you experienced compassion from God or someone else?
- 2. Lamentations 3:22-23 says, "Because of the Lord's great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness." What does it mean when the writer tells us that God's compassion never fails?
- 3. Read Jonah 3:1-4. How did Jonah receive God's compassion? Why did God want to give compassion to the Ninevites?
- 4. Jonah shared "God's message" with the people of Nineveh. Do we ever get in the way of receiving or sharing God's message? Explain?
- 5. How was God's compassion "right on time" for Jonah and the people of Nineveh? Describe a time when God's compassion had perfect timing in your life?
- 6. Read Jonah 3:5-9. What did the people of Nineveh do to demonstrate that they wanted to receive God's compassion? What do you think clothing yourself in "sackcloth and ashes" feels like (Esther 4:1-3)?
- 7. What should we do to show God we need His compassion? Explain.
- 8. God has a heart for compassion (2 Chronicles 7:14-15 & 1 Peter 3:8-9). What did the people of Nineveh hope God would do for them?
- 9. What kind of compassion do you/we need from God right now?
- 10. Read Jonah 3:10. Do we ever underestimate God's compassionate power to transform our lives and the lives of those we love? Explain?
- 11. What do you think of the description of Jesus found in Matthew 9:35-38?
- 12. How do you see Jesus? Is He a Good Shepherd?
- 13. How has Jesus shown compassion and mercy to you?
- 14. To close the group, pray, by first name, for one person you want God to show His transformational love and compassion to this week?
