## Section 1: Saved and Called

**Main Teaching Summary:** There is no such thing as saved and not called. Every believer is purged to serve and gifted to impact their generation.

**Key Scriptures:**

- Hebrews 9:14
- Acts 13

**Reflection Questions:**

- What does it mean to you that every believer is called?
- How are you using your gifts to serve your generation?

**Personal Application:** List one way you can step into your calling this week and serve someone around you.

**Prayer Prompt:** Father, thank You for calling me. I choose to embrace Your purpose for my life. Use me to serve my generation with boldness and love.

## Section 2: Living with an Eternal Perspective

**Main Teaching Summary:** We are temporary residents of this world. An eternal perspective helps us live focused and purposefully.

**Key Scriptures:**

- 1 Peter 2:11

**Reflection Questions:**

- What distractions have kept you from living with an eternal mindset?
- How can you remind yourself daily of your heavenly citizenship?

**Personal Application:** Identify one area of your life where you can shift your focus to eternal impact.

**Prayer Prompt:** God, help me live for what truly matters. Give me eyes to see eternity and a heart that beats for Your kingdom.

## Section 3: Use Your Gifts Well

**Main Teaching Summary:** God has given each believer gifts. We are responsible to discover and develop them for His glory.

**Key Scriptures:**

- Romans 12:6–8

**Reflection Questions:**

- What spiritual gifts do you believe God has given you?
- How can you use them more effectively in this season?

**Personal Application:** Choose one gift and write how you will intentionally grow in it this week.

**Prayer Prompt:** Lord, thank You for the gifts You've placed in me. Teach me to use them well and bring You glory through them.

## Section 4: The Anointing Follows the Call

**Main Teaching Summary:** God doesn't call the equipped; He equips the called. The anointing empowers you to fulfill His purpose.

**Key Scriptures:**

- Isaiah 55:11
- Psalm 19:14

**Reflection Questions:**

- What area of your life do you need to surrender for God's anointing?
- How has God confirmed His call on your life?

**Personal Application:** Write down one specific step to embrace the anointing of God in your daily life.

**Prayer Prompt:** Holy Spirit, I surrender every part of my life to You. Anoint my words, thoughts, and actions to glorify Jesus.

## Section 5: The Anointing of Joy

**Main Teaching Summary:** Joy is not optional—it is your strength and inheritance. The joy of the Lord is essential to walking in your calling.

**Key Scriptures:**

- Acts 20:24
- Romans 14:17
- Isaiah 61:1–3
- Psalm 16:11
- Psalm 23:5

**Reflection Questions:**

- What steals your joy the most?
- How can you cultivate joy in the presence of God daily?

**Personal Application:** Write a joy declaration to speak over your life every morning this week.

**Prayer Prompt:** Jesus, restore to me the joy of my salvation. Let joy overflow in every area of my life as I walk in Your presence.

## Section 6: The Anointing for Multiplication

**Main Teaching Summary:** God has called you to multiply, not maintain. His anointing turns small beginnings into supernatural increase.

**Key Scriptures:**

- Genesis 1:28
- Matthew 14:13–21

**Reflection Questions:**

- Where in your life do you need to believe God for multiplication?
- How can you bring your 'loaves and fish' to Jesus this week?

**Personal Application:** List one resource, talent, or opportunity you will offer to God to multiply.

**Prayer Prompt:** Lord, I bring You what I have. Breathe on it and multiply it for Your kingdom and glory.
