“The whole community wept aloud... ‘Wouldn’t it be better for us to return to Egypt?’ They plotted, ‘Let’s choose a new leader and go back to Egypt!’” – Numbers 14:1,3–4

LONGING FOR SLAVERY

God had set Israel free. But...
FREEDOM FELT HARD.
SLAVERY FELT FAMILIAR.
So they longed to return.

And we do the same.

Sin feels easy... familiar
It promises comfort.
It promises life.

Problem is... Jesus said,
“Everyone who sins is A SLAVE to sin.” (Jn 8:34)
Paul said sin leads to death. (Rom 6:16)
There’s a war inside us –
pulling us back toward SLAVERY. (Rom 7:23)

Jesus calls us to something harder -
to deny ourselves, take up our cross, and follow Him. (Luke 9:23)

Following Jesus FEELS HARD. But it leads to life.
Don’t go back to Egypt. Don’t go back to sin.
Because CHRIST HAS SET YOU FREE.
And “if the Son sets you free,
you will be free indeed.” (Jn 8:36)

Day 2 – Jan 5

“You do not desire a sacrifice, or I would offer one. You do not want a burnt offering. The sacrifice you desire is a broken spirit; you will not reject a broken and repentant heart, O God.” - Psalm 51:16 - 17

THE SACRIFICE GOD ACCEPTS

God is more concerned with what's going on INSIDE you than what's happening OUTSIDE you.

David knew it. He still brought sacrifices to the altar. (Ps 51:19)
But he realized God wanted his HEART first.

Jesus said the same.

“First clean the INSIDE of the cup,
and then the OUTSIDE will be clean also.” (Matt 23:26)

The truth is, we can go through all the motions -
sing the songs, pray the prayers,
serve at church, give our offering -
and still miss the sacrifice God desires.

What He won't reject is this:
A BROKEN AND REPENTANT HEART.

Repentance isn't shame. It's surrender.
It's admitting our need. It's running back to grace.

And it's His kindness - shown most clearly at the cross -
that leads us there. (Rom 2:4)

Do you give God the sacrifice He desires?

“The earth opened its mouth and swallowed the men, along with their households and all their followers... The earth closed over them, and they vanished from among the people of Israel.” - Numbers 16:32-33

THE REAL GOD VS YOUR MADE-UP GOD

I'll never forget when a teacher read this passage -
God swallowing people whole -
and then asked: “Is THIS your God?
Is this the God you worship? Can your God do this?”

The catch is - of course - THE REAL GOD did.

Whether you understand it... agree with it... like it...
THE REAL GOD did.

And He has done, and will do,
countless things beyond our comprehension.

Because His thoughts are higher.
His ways are greater. (Isa 55:8-9)

Even the disciples often misunderstood Jesus.
They questioned His choices. They struggled to agree.
But He was still right.

The goal of faith is not make-up a god that conforms to us.
It's to be transformed – to conform to HIM. (Rom 12:1-2)

“Everything in Israel that is set apart for the Lord also belongs to you... The Lord said to Aaron, ‘You priests will receive no allotment of land or share of property among the people of Israel. I am your share and your allotment.’” – Numbers 18:14,20

YOU OWN NOTHING AND EVERYTHING

The priests had a unique role in Israel.
They received no land. No inheritance. No share of property.

God was their portion. Their allotment. Their everything.

And yet - the offerings brought to God
were also given to them for provision.

They owned NOTHING. And... they owned EVERYTHING.

Here's the kicker - WE ARE PRIESTS too.

In Christ, we are a royal priesthood. (1 Pet 2:9)
We are made to serve the Father. (Rev 1:6)

And as His priests:
Everything we have belongs to Him. (1 Cor 6:19–20)
And everything He has belongs to us. (Rom 8:16–17)

GOD'S DEEP CARE

Can you imagine someone collecting your tears?

Every single one?

In a bottle?

Written down in a book?

To do that, they'd have to be:

Always with you. Always attentive. ALWAYS ready to care.

That is who God is.

Jesus promised, “I am with you ALWAYS.” (Matt 28:20)

He knows the very number of hairs on your head. (Matt 10:30)

He weeps with us when we weep. (John 11:35)

Your pain is not forgotten.

“Moses raised his hand and struck the rock twice with the staff, and water gushed out. So the entire community and their livestock drank their fill.” – Numbers 20:11

JESUS WAS STRUCK SO WE CAN DRINK

Israel was thirsty. Dying in the desert - or so they thought.

So God told Moses to strike the rock.
And from that blow came water.
Life. Sustenance. Enough for everyone.

But this was more than survival. It was a sign.

Paul says, “They drank from the spiritual rock... and THAT ROCK WAS CHRIST.” (1 Cor 10:4)

Because we rebelled, God sent His representative—Jesus.
HE WAS STRUCK - on the cross.
And from Him flows LIVING WATER. (John 7:38)

The blow that killed Him became the source that gives us life.

LIVE BY LOOKING AT THE ONE LIFTED

Israel grew impatient with God. So... they rebelled.
Their rebellion brought judgment - a curse of death.

But God provided a way out.
A bronze serpent lifted high.
All they had to do was look - and live.

The same is true for us.

Jesus said, “Just as Moses lifted up the snake in the wilderness, so THE SON OF MAN MUST BE LIFTED UP, that everyone who believes may have eternal life in Him.” (John 3:14–15)

We grew impatient with God. So... we rebelled.

LONGING FOR GOD

One of my favorite pastors once asked three questions fake Christians can't answer.

One of them is:

“How real has God been to your heart this week?
Do you actually sense His presence in your life?”

Real Christians PINE for God's presence.
Fake Christians ARE FINE without it.

Real Christians SEEK HIM daily, hourly, regularly.
Fake Christians feel NO URGENCY TO MEET with Him at all.

David shows us the difference.
He searches for God. He thirsts for God.
He longs for God. He praises God.
That's why... David was called a man after God's own heart. (Acts 13:22)

God's unfailing love was better to him than life itself. (Ps 63:3)
Better than comfort. Better than success. Better than survival.

So what about you?
Are you content without Him?

thirsty until He fills you?

THERE IS NO CONDEMNATION

Balak wanted Israel cursed.
He wanted them condemned.
But they were God’s people.
And God’s people could only be blessed.

The same is true for us in Christ.

Paul declares, “There is now NO CONDEMNATION for those who belong to Christ Jesus.” (Rom 8:1)

Why?

Because JESUS TOOK THE CURSE on Himself. (Gal 3:13)
The condemnation we deserved fell on Him at the cross.

And once you belong to Him,
you are free. No curse. NO CONDEMNATION.

Just to make sure we get it, Paul piles it on:
“Nothing can separate us from the love of God
that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.” (Rom 8:38–39)

Not sin. Not death. Not powers. Not anything in all creation.

In Christ - you are secure.
You are loved. YOU ARE BLESSED.

A lesson we all must learn: God does what He will.

GOOD NEWS ON TRUE STRENGTH

In our world, the strong eat the weak.
That's how power works. That's how kingdoms rise.

But God is different.

The STRONGEST ONE cares for the WEAKEST.
He defends widows. He fathers the fatherless.
He places the lonely in families. He sets prisoners free.

True strength is not crushing the weak.

WE NEVER SIN IN ISOLATION

The psalmist knew his sins didn’t stop with him.
They had A RIPPLE EFFECT.

Our actions - good or evil - are like throwing a rock into a pond.
The ripples reach everyone around us.

My sin affects my spouse, my kids, my church.
My sin can even affect people I’ve never met.

That’s why David prayed: “Don’t let those who trust in You be ashamed BECAUSE OF ME.”

Sin always spreads further than we think.
It wounds reputations. It damages witness.
It shames God’s people.

That’s why Jesus taught us to pray:
“Lead us not into temptation,
but deliver us from the evil one.” (Matt 6:13)

We cannot afford to take sin lightly. Not for our sake.
Not for the sake of others.

God didn’t take sin lightly.
The Sinless One took on our sins for us (1 Cor 5:21)
An that has RIPPLE EFFECTS into eternity.

Prayer: Father, thank You for paying the penalty for my sins. Help me resist temptation and walk in holiness, for the good of others and the glory of Your name.

HIS SPIRIT OUR POWER

Joshua wasn't chosen to lead

He was chosen because HE HAD THE HOLY SPIRIT.

And when the Spirit filled him, the gifts followed.

LONG-TERM PERSPECTIVE

The psalmist looked at those who rejected God.

They looked beautiful. (v 4)

They looked powerful. (v 5)

They thrived.

They claimed self-sufficiency. (vv 9,11)

And when he looked too long - HE ENVIED.

Makes sense, doesn't it?

The wicked seem to win. To prosper. To get ahead.

But then...

HE REMEMBERED THE LONG-TERM PERSPECTIVE.

The rich without God will be eternally poor.

The famous without God will be eternally forgotten. (vv 18–20)

What looks like strength is only temporary.

What looks like success is only fleeting.

That's why Jesus told us: “Do not store up treasures on earth, but store them in heaven.” (Matt 6:19–21)

Because the proud will fall. The wicked will fade.

But eternal life belongs to those who trust in Him.

When you see the world prosper, don't envy. REMEMBER.

WHEN GOD ALLOWS EVIL

The Babylonians tore Jerusalem down.
They burned the temple.
They defiled God's holy place. IT WAS EVIL.
And yet - GOD ALLOWED IT.

Why? Because His people had blatantly disobeyed Him.
So God used another nation
to discipline His own. (Jer 25:8–14)

But the psalmist DIDN'T UNDERSTAND. “How long, O Lord?”

The same was true with Jesus.
He told Peter about His coming suffering and death.
Peter DIDN'T UNDERSTAND.
It looked like evil had won. . (Matt 16:21–23)

And the same is true for us.
We face moments where EVIL SEEKS unchecked.
Where suffering makes no sense. Where God seems silent.

But Scripture is clear:
- God never causes evil. (James 1:13)
- Yet He redeems it FOR OUR GOOD. (Rom 8:28)

When God allows evil, it is never without purpose.
It is never beyond redemption. And it is never outside His love.

Prayer: Father, thank You for redeeming the evil in my life and using it for good. Help me trust Your purposes even when I don't understand.

OUR EVIL, GOD’S GLORY

God uses everything - even human evil - to bring Himself glory.

Joseph knew it. “You meant it for evil,
but God meant it for good - to save many lives.” (Gen 50:20)

THE CROSS proves it.

Jesus was handed over by God’s plan,
yet wicked men nailed Him there. (Acts 2:23)
Evil thought it had won.
But it ONLY FULFILLED GOD’S PURPOSE.

Death itself shows it.

It’s been “SWALLOWED UP IN VICTORY.” (1 Cor 15:54)
And our lives confirm it.
“We know that in all things God works for the good

This is not an excuse for sin.

Evil is still evil. Sin is still rebellion.
But none of it can thwart His plan.

GOD REMEMBERS YOU

Psalm 78 gives us a striking contrast.

The Israelites DID NOT REMEMBER GOD and His power.
They forgot His rescue.
THEY TURNED TO SIN and suffered destruction.

But GOD REMEMBERED THEM.
“He remembered they were but flesh,
a passing breeze that does not return.” (v 39)
So He showed mercy. HE FORGAVE THEIR SINS. (v 38)

THE DISCIPLINE OF GOD
