#### **Make It Personal with Prayer**

· index cards

Pray for your group before they arrive -> Ask God to prepare the hearts of preteens who are walking through your door. Some are full of questions, some are ready to lead, some are just figuring things out. Thank God for the reminder that He saw something special in David, even when others didn't. He saw David's heart, full of love for Him. Thank God for seeing the same potential in every kid in your group! Pray that they would feel seen, known, and loved by God. Ask the Holy Spirit to help them lean into God's wisdom, even when they don't feel strong, important, or ready.

#### Inclusive Pro Tips

If this activity works best when the kids work and reflect independently, allow them to do so.

#### What You Do


- 1. Give each kid one Fast Pass card from the "Fast Pass" Activity Page and a pencil or pen.
- 2. Encourage them to write their names on their "Fast Pass."
- 3. Invite them to form groups of 2-3.
- 4. Direct the kids to read the verse on their cards aloud to their group and answer the reflection questions on the back together.
- 5. After reflection time, gather the entire group together.
- 6. Invite kids to share their verses and their insights with the group if comfortable.

Make It Personal → Share an age-appropriate time when God helped you make a wise choice. Briefly explain the situation, how you felt, and how God showed up!

#### **Explain:**

- A "Fast Pass" gets you to the front of the line at an amusement park.
- Wisdom is like a fast pass that leads you through life well.
   And God wants to give you wisdom! When we read the Bible,
   pause to reflect, and ask the Holy Spirit for help, God can
   speak directly to you and show you how to live wisely! God
   wants to give you wisdom!
- God wants to give you wisdom right now, not just when you're older. You might not be picking a college or deciding on a job yet, but you are choosing how to treat your friends, how to respond when someone's unkind, or what to do when you feel left out. God cares about every single one of those moments, He goes through every single one of those moments with you through His Spirit, and as you seek Him, He will help you navigate them all!

**NOTE:** Each week, kids will receive a "Fast Pass." Encourage them to collect them and take them home!

What You Need

### **What You Do**

- 1. Assign kids character roles or let them choose.
  - Samuel
  - Saul
  - Jesse
  - David
  - David's Brothers (AT LEAST 3, UP TO 7)
  - Goliath
- 2. Give each of them a "Story Script" Activity Page.
- 3. Prompt them to identify their characters' lines and actions by color on the script.
- 4. Invite the remaining kids to be the audience.
- 5. Read the Narrator lines from the "Story Script" Activity Page as the kids act out the story.
- → NOTE: Pick another kid to read the Narrator lines.
- 6. Celebrate the kids for playing along once the script is finished!

#### **Talk Together:**

#### Ask:

- Why do you think God picked David and not one of the older brothers?
- · What do you think it looks like to have a heart that loves God?
- · What do you think courage has to do with wisdom?

### **Disccusion QUESTIONS**

#### Ask the following:

- 1. What does it mean to be wise?
- 2. Why do you think God wants us to grow in wisdom?
- 3. What makes it hard to make the wise choice when others around you choose not to?
- 4. What helps you listen to God when making a decision?
- 5. What can you pray to help you turn to God and ask Him for wisdom as you go through life with Him?



Inclusive Pro Tips

If kids struggle with reading, have the SGL read and the kids act.

#### Narrator:

In the beginning, God made the world—and people!

He made people to be His close friends! But when
people turned away from God and sinned, they
couldn't be close to God anymore. Still, God had a
rescue plan. He chose Abraham's family to be
part of it.

(Time jump motion-fast forward arms!)

God's people asked for a king, even though God was their TRUE King. So, God gave them Saul.

(Saul stands tall, looking proud.)

#### Narrator:

Saul looked like a great king, but he didn't always listen to God. So God told Samuel to find the next king.

(Samuel walks in, looking around. Jesse brings in his sons one by one.)

#### Samuel:

"Whoa, this one looks strong. Is this the one, God?"

#### Narrator:

God said, "No. I don't look at the outside. I look at the heart. I want a king who loves Me."

#### Samuel:

"Jesse, are these all your sons?"

#### Jesse:

"Well ... there's David. He's just a shepherd."

(David runs in, pretending to hold a sheep)

#### God (Read by leader):

"He's the one! He loves Me! Anoint him!"

(Samuel pretends to pour oil on David's head.)

#### Narrator:

Even though David was the youngest, God saw that David loved Him. But David didn't become king right away. First, he faced a GIANT challenge.

(Goliath enters with BIG stomps, and a big voice.)

#### Goliath:

"Who will fight me?!"

(David steps up.)

#### David:

"I come to you in the name of the Lord! God will give me victory! He is stronger than any weapon you have!"

(David spins a pretend slingshot, throws stone, and Goliath dramatically falls!)

#### Narrator:

God gave David the wisdom and courage to trust Him. David won the battle—not because he was big, but because his heart was big for God.

(Everyone cheers in a victory pose!)

#### Narrator:

David would one day become king, and later, Jesus would be born into David's family! God's great rescue would come from David! Godly wisdom doesn't always look impressive on the outside ... but it does start with loving and trusting God on the inside!



# Verses to Take with You





Memory Verse Activity

#### What You Need

- Bibles
- Prepared index cards with Proverbs 16:16
- Timer
- Blindfold

#### What You Do

- 1. Divide the group into two teams.
- 2. Give each team a Bible and direct them to look up this month's Memory Verse, Proverbs 16:16.
- 3. Use the Bible Navigation tips below to help kids find the verse.
- 4. Repeat the verse together several times.

#### **Play Together:**

- 1. Give both teams a set of Proverbs 16:16 index cards and a blindfold.
- 2. At your signal, the teams will race to arrange the verse in correct order.
- 3. Play several rounds, inviting the kids to place the verse in order using these directives:
  - <u>Silently:</u> The kids will place the verse in order together without speaking.
  - <u>Blindfolded:</u> Teams will blindfold a kid and direct the kid to place the verse in order.
- 4. Celebrate the teams as they finish the verse.
- 5. Remind the kids that when they memorize Scripture, they hide truth in their hearts. That means when they face tough decisions, they already have God's Word ready to guide them.

#### **Talk Together:**

- 1. Instruct the teams to look up these words of Jesus in their Bibles.
- 2. John 14:26: "The Father will send the Friend in my name to help you. The Friend is the Holy Spirit. He will teach you all things. He will remind you of everything I have said to you." (NIrV).
- What do you think it means that the Holy Spirit is our Friend who helps us and reminds us what Jesus said?
- 3. Why do you think Jesus wanted us to have the Holy Spirit after He left earth?
- 4. John 16:13: "When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth" (NIrV).
- What does it mean that the Holy Spirit is the Spirit of truth?
- How do you think the Holy Spirit guides us today? (THROUGH THE BIBLE? THROUGH A FEELING? THROUGH SOMEONE WISE?)
- What are some ways people might hear lies instead of the truth in their daily lives?

#### \*Finding verses with 4th-5th graders

- 1. Ask kids to tell you if the book of the Bible they're looking for is in the Old Testament or New Testament. If it's in the Old, instruct kids to flip slowly, starting at the front of the Bible and heading toward the back, until they find the book they're looking for. If it's in the New, instruct kids to start flipping from the back, going forward to find the book they're looking for.
- 2. When they find the book, explain that the big numbers on the page are the chapter numbers.
- 3. Once they find the chapter, explain that the small numbers are verse numbers. Tell kids to find the verse within the chapter they've already found.

Inclusive Pro Tips

Allow the kids to draw or doodle to God on the index card if that works best for the kids in your group.

#### What You Do

- 1. Invite every kid to find a quiet space in your group area.
- 2. Give each kid an index card and a pencil.
- Direct them to write a short prayer asking God to help them be wise this week.
- 4. Once everyone is finished, prompt them to do one of the following with their cards:
  - → Give it to a leader if they want someone to pray for them this week.
  - → Keep it and take it home.

God, thank You for each of my friends here today. I'm so glad that we don't have to have the perfect words to come to You—You just want our hearts! You are all-knowing. You are in control. You're never confused or caught off guard. That means we can be real with You about a tough decision, a friendship, or something we're confused about. Help us to remember You want to help us make wise choices each day! Remind us to pause and ask You: 'What should I do?' We love You, God. We pray these things in Jesus' name. Amen.
