Social

1. Tissue Dance

What You Need:

□ Facial tissues

What You Do:

Before the Activity: Ask children to stand in a single line on one side of the room.

During the Activity: Place a single tissue on each child's head. Instruct the children to walk across the room, one at a time, while trying to keep the tissue on their heads. When tissues fall off, encourage children to help each other put the tissues back on each other's heads and continue.

After the Activity: Introduce the Bible Story.

What You Say:

Before the Activity: "Friends, line up beside me. I have a fun game for us to play today."

During the Activity: "Do you think this tissue will stay on your head as you walk to the other side of the room? Watch me. (Demonstrate.) When it's your turn, I'll place this tissue on your head, and you'll walk to the other side of the room. Try to keep the tissue on your head, just like I did. [Child's name], let's give it a try. (Pause.) Remember, it's okay if the tissue falls off. We can ask our friends to help us place it back on our head and keep going. (Pause.) Wow! What great friends you are to help each other keep the game going!" (Repeat as desired.)

After the Activity: "Raise your hand if your tissue fell off while you were walking. (Look for responses.) Yes, we lost our tissues a lot, but we had friends to help us put them back on, didn't we? In our Bible Story today, we're going to hear about some friends that helped each other by praying for each other. Let's go hear all about these friends."

Transition

Move to Worship and Story by continuing the activity and let the leader walk with the tissue on their head. The children can help put it back if it falls off.

Lesson Activities

1. Memory Verse Activity- Heart Jump

What You Need:

□ Painter's tape

What You Do:

Before the Activity: Create a large heart outline on the floor with tape. Say the verse together as you do the motions.

During the Activity: Encourage children to walk on the heart as you say the verse together. When you get to the word heart, encourage children to jump inside the heart. Repeat as desired.

After the Activity: Connect the Memory Verse to the Bottom Line.

What You Say:

Before the Activity: "Look at this shape. Does anyone know what it is? (Pause for responses.) Yes, it's a heart! Everyone come stand on the heart with me. Let's get ready to say our verse together as we do the motions. Here we go! 'I will give thanks (move flat hand forward from chin) to the Lord (point up) with my whole heart, '(tap heart twice) Psalm 111:1. (Open hands like a book.) That was fantastic!"

During the Activity: "Now let's walk around the heart going this way (point) as we say the words to our Memory Verse. Ready to walk? Here we go! 'I will give thanks to the LORD with my whole heart,' Psalm 111:1. Everybody freeze where you are. (Pause.) The next time we say our verse, when we say the word heart, I want you to jump inside the heart. Let's practice jumping in. Heart! Jump in! (Pause.) Great job everyone! Now go back and stand on the heart and we'll start walking again. Ready? Let's go! 'I will give thanks to the LORD with my whole heart.' Oh! We said heart, let's jump into the heart! (Pause.) Great job! Okay everyone get back on the heart and let's do it again. (Repeat as desired.) You did so good walking around the heart and jumping inside it! It's so much fun to learn our Memory Verse together!"

After the Activity: "The Bible tells us that we can thank God for everything and with our whole heart! We can thank God for family, food, friends, people who help us... for everything! Who can thank God for everything? [Bottom Line] I can thank God for everything!"

2. Bible Story Review- Story Puzzles

What You Need:

☐ "Story Puzzles" Activity Page

What You Do:

During the Activity: Invite children to help put together the four 2-piece puzzles. Review the Bible Story as you put the puzzles together. Talk about how God gave Daniel friends who prayed for him. God gives us friends too! We can thank God for our friends, because we can thank God for everything!

After the Activity: Introduce the Bible Story.

What You Say:

Before the Activity: "I need some friends to help me put these puzzles together. Can you help me?"

During the Activity: (Start with the King Nebuchadnezzar puzzle.) "Look! It's the king from our Bible Story. The king had a dream and needed help. He was angry because no one could help him.

(Work the Daniel puzzle second.) "This puzzle has Daniel on it. Daniel went to the king and said he could help him if he would give him some time, and the king said yes.

(Work the Shadrach, Meshach, Abednego, and Daniel Puzzle next.) "Aww...this one is of Daniel and his friends! Daniel went to his friends Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego and asked them to pray for him. And they did!

(Work the King Nebuchadnezzar and Daniel puzzle last.) "This puzzle is the end of our story. Daniel thanked God for telling him how to help the king. Then Daniel went to the king and helped him understand what his dream meant.

"That was fun! Let's mix up the pieces and work the puzzles again!"

After the Activity: "Thank you for helping me put these puzzles together! You are such good friends. Daniel had good friends who helped him too. We can thank God for our friends, because we can thank God for everything. Who can thank God for everything? [Bottom Line] I can thank God for everything!"

3. Craft- Thankful Table Topper



What You Need:

"Thankful Table Topper" Activity Page
crayons
Self-inking heart and smiley face stamps
Stickers
Clear tape or Glue sticks
Permanent marker

What You Do:

Before the Activity: Fold each paper on the designated lines, then lay flat. Write each child's name on their paper.

During the Activity: Encourage children to decorate their paper with crayons and stamps. Help each child fold their paper into a triangular table tent then rub glue across the tab to secure it.

After the Activity: Connect the Bottom Line to the Bible Story.

What You Say:

Before the Activity: "Friends! Come join me at the table. I have something for you to make that will help you remember today's true story from the Bible. You can place it on your table at home."

During the Activity: "Look at your paper and point to the section with Daniel and his friends, Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego. (Pause.) Daniel asked his friends to pray. The friends prayed and talked to God and asked God to help. (Daniel 2:17,18) Color that part of your paper. (Pause.)

"This part (point) says, 'I will give thanks to the Lord with my whole heart.' Psalm 111:1. Decorate it with stamps and stickers. (Pause.) These are looking great! There is one more section and the words on this page say [Bottom Line] I can thank God for everything. Draw a picture of you and a friend on this part. (Pause.) Wow, fantastic!

"Now we get to fold it to make it stand. (Assist each child as needed.) Let's rub some glue along the tab and press it together to keep the ends together. (Assist each child as needed.) See how it stands? Turn it around to see all the sides!"

After the Activity: "In today's true story from the Bible, we learned about a wise man named Daniel. He worked for King Nebuchadnezzar helping the king know what to do.

"When the king had a dream that worried him, he asked his wise men to help him understand it. But they didn't know what it meant, and this made the king angry. Daniel knew that only God could help. So he asked his friends, Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego to pray to God for help. God showed Daniel how to help the king! (Daniel 2:19) Daniel told the king all about his dream and what it meant. (Daniel 2:27-45) The king was so thankful to know what his dream meant.

"God gave Daniel really good friends. God gives us friends too. We can pray for our friends and ask them to pray for us too. We can thank God for our friends, and for everything! Who can you thank for everything? [Bottom Line] I can thank God for everything."
