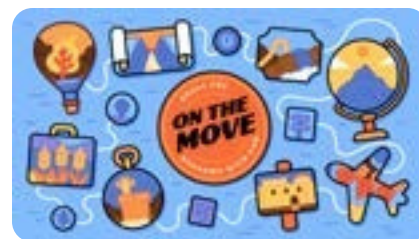

## Bottom Line

**God can give you courage when you don't feel ready.**

## Memory Verse

**"When I'm afraid, I put my trust in you."  
Psalm 56:3**

Pray for your group before they arrive

Pray for kids who will visit your group for the first time. Recall a time when God gave you the courage to do something you didn't think you were ready for. Thank God for being with you through the Holy Spirit and sending the Holy Spirit to help you take the next step! Ask God to help the kids trust Him when they feel nervous or unsure. Whether it's a big change or something small, pray that kids would know God is with them even when they don't feel ready.

### Inclusive Pro Tips

Offer sedentary movement options like clapping or swaying arms side to side

## What You Do

1. Before you begin, tape the 'Burning Bush' sign from the "Location Signs" Activity Pages in your group area. (This will be your finish line.)
2. Use the painter's tape to mark a start line for the kids to stand behind on the other end of your group space.
3. Inform the kids that they will be traveling to three different places to follow Moses' journey.

### Activity Directions:

#### The Burning Bush

- Instruct the kids to line up on the other end of your group space, facing the 'Burning Bush' sign.
- Say, "When I shine the flashlight ON the sign, slow hop forward. When I turn the flashlight OFF, freeze in place!"
- Hit "freeze" three times (turn the flashlight off) to ask questions that are below
- End by keeping the flashlight on so that every kid reaches the 'Burning Bush' sign by slow hopping.

#### The Plagues

- Direct the kids to travel back to the start line.
- Replace the bush and 'Burning Bush' sign with 'The Plagues' sign.
- Say, "When you hear the music, frog hop towards me! When the music stops, freeze in place!"
- Stop the music three times to ask questions from questions below
- End by keeping the music on so that every kid reaches 'The Plagues' Sign by frog hopping.

#### The Red Sea

- Replace the 'The Plagues' sign with the 'The Red Sea' sign.
- Divide the kids into two teams: 'God's People' and 'The Egyptians.'
- Say, "If you're one of God's people, walk quickly to 'The Red Sea' sign! When I say 'Freeze!' freeze in place."
- Let "God's people" travel a bit, and then shout, "Freeze!"
- Say, "Now, if you're an Egyptian, chase behind God's people by hopping on one foot! When I say 'Freeze!' you must freeze in place."
- Say "Freeze!" three times to ask questions from the "Review"
- End the game by declaring God's people safe!

## REVIEW QUESTIONS:

### Burning Bush

1. Who spoke to Moses from the burning bush? (Answer: God did! He called Moses by name.)
2. What did God tell Moses to do? (Answer: Lead His people out of Egypt.)
3. Why was Moses afraid? (Answer: He didn't feel ready or brave enough to speak to Pharaoh.)

### The Plagues

1. What did Moses ask Pharaoh to do? (Answer: Let God's people go!)
2. Name two plagues God sent to Egypt. (Possible answers: water into blood, frogs, gnats, flies, plague that killed all of the Egyptians' livestock, painful boils on all Egyptians, locusts, darkness, hail, and death of the firstborn son)
3. Why did Pharaoh keep saying "No"? (Answer: His heart was hard. Pharaoh didn't want to give up control.)

### The Red Sea

1. How did God help His people escape Pharaoh's army? (Answer: God parted the Red Sea so they could walk through on dry land.)
2. What happened to Pharaoh's army? (Answer: The sea closed and they were swept away!)
3. How did Moses show courage in this part of the story? (Example: He obeyed God and trusted Him.)

## What You Say

"Wow! What an incredible story! Moses didn't think he was ready to lead God's people, but God showed him over and over how He would help. And Moses trusted God and went to talk to Pharaoh, even though he was scared. Have you ever felt like you weren't ready for something? Maybe starting a new grade, speaking in front of your class, or doing something for the first time? (PAUSE FOR ANSWERS.) Moses felt that way too.

"But God didn't just give Moses a task. God gave Moses everything he needed to be brave—including telling Moses that He Himself would be with him! God showed His power through the plagues, protected His people during Passover, and made a miracle happen when He parted the Red Sea! And the entire time, when doing all of those powerful things, God Himself went with Moses.

"And there's something else that's awesome in this story! God has been planning His rescue for a long, long time, and He gave His people, and us, a picture in this story. Passover was a big picture pointing to Jesus! Jesus is the Lamb of God who gave His life to save us. It's His blood that saves us forever so we can be closer than close to God again!

"And one of the ways we are closer than close to God is that when we choose to follow Jesus, the Holy Spirit comes to live inside of us. God Himself is with us all of the time. He is with us and He helps us—just like He went with Moses and helped him. So, whenever you feel scared or not ready, remember: [BOTTOM LINE] God can give you courage when you don't feel ready."

## What You Do

- Before you begin, hang the three "Courage Trail Markers" Activity Pages in various areas of your group space.  
→ NOTE: If you can't hang the pages, place them on the floor in various areas of your group space.
- Gather the kids in a circle.
- Give each kid a walking stick.
- Set the coloring supplies and rows of stickers from the "Verse Stickers" Activity Page in the middle of the circle.

### Talk Together:

- "Today, we're making Courage Sticks! These sticks remind us that just like God was with Moses, God is with each of us no matter what! God goes with us every step of the way!"

### Create Together:

- Invite the kids to decorate their walking stick with the coloring supplies.
- Instruct the kids to choose a set of "Verse Stickers" from the middle of the circle.
- Direct them to color the three stickers from the "Verse Stickers" Activity Page before adhering them to their stick.
- Encourage kids to write a few short encouraging statements on their sticks, like:
  - God is always with me.
  - God will give me whatever I need!
  - God helps me be brave.

### Play Together:

- Lead the kids on a "Courage Walk" to each of the three 'Trail Markers.'
- As you approach each sign:
  - Read the verse aloud.
  - Invite the kids to point out the verse on their stick.
  - Ask: "What do you think this verse is saying?"

## What You Say

"Look at these awesome courage sticks! These sticks were fun to make. And even better? They remind us of a BIG truth: we are never walking alone!"

"Have you ever had to do something that felt big and scary? (INVITE RESPONSES.) Yep, me too. That's totally normal. Even Moses felt that way. Whether we're preparing for a school project, moving to a new city, or preparing to apologize to a friend, God promises us He will be with us. ALWAYS!"

"Let's think about the walking stick you just made. What do they do? (PAUSE FOR ANSWERS LIKE 'HELP YOU WALK,' 'HELP YOU BALANCE,') That's right! A walking stick might help you with balance or help you feel steady on a rocky path. Now let's think about God. The same God who created the world and everything in it knows that life isn't always easy. He knew that the curse of sin would make the world feel hard sometimes. So God shared this promise with us: He will always be with us."

"When we choose to follow Jesus, God sends the Holy Spirit to live in us. To help us. To give us courage when we don't feel ready. To go with us every step of the way! That's why we made these Courage Sticks: to remind us that God's Spirit goes with us all of the time, every step of our lives."

"This week, pick one of the verses from today and look it up again at home. Write it down. Stick it somewhere you'll see it! Ask God to help you remember that He is with you, and because He is, you can take one brave step this week, whatever that looks like for you. [BOTTOM LINE] God can give you courage when you don't feel ready!"

Make It Personal → Think about an age-appropriate time when you didn't feel ready, and when you were reminded God was with you, that gave you the courage to do something that felt uncomfortable. Maybe you had to give a speech. Or maybe you visited an unfamiliar place by yourself. How did you feel before doing it, and how did you feel after you were done?

## Inclusive Pro Tips

Cut and tape words on buttons so kids can push each button to recite the verse.

## What You Do

1. Give every kid a Bible.
2. Invite the kids to look up Psalm 56:3 using the Bible Navigation tips below.
3. Repeat the verse together several times.

### Move Together:

1. Demonstrate the verse motions.
  - When I'm afraid, (Make a frightened face.)
  - I put my trust (Cup hands together.)
  - in you. (Point both fingers to the sky.)
  - Psalm 56:3 (Hold hands like an open Bible.)
2. Try it slowly at first, then faster, then in a whisper voice to keep the kids engaged.
3. Gather to discuss.

## What You Say

"Amazing job, friends! I love reading the Bible with each of you. This verse comes from a time when King David was in REAL danger. He was afraid and didn't know what was going to happen next. But instead of giving up, he chose to trust God! You and I might not face the same things David did, but we do feel scared sometimes. And when we do, we can do what David did. We can remember that God is with us and trust Him!

"When you choose to follow Jesus, God gives you the Holy Spirit to live inside you. That means you're never facing hard things alone. And He can give you courage to face whatever is coming your way. [BOTTOM LINE] God can give you courage when you don't feel ready."

### \*Finding verses with 2nd-3rd graders

1. Guide them to open their Bibles to the front and find the table of contents. (HOLD UP A BIBLE OPENED TO THE TABLE OF CONTENTS TO SHOW THE KIDS WHAT THE PAGE LOOKS LIKE.)
2. When the kids find the table of contents, lead them to find the name of the book in the list.
3. When they find the book, lead them to look at the page number beside it. Explain that the number tells them on what page they can find that book. Help the kids find the page.
4. When they find the book, explain that the big numbers on the page are the chapter numbers. Help them find the correct chapter.
5. Then explain that the small numbers are verse numbers. Help them find the correct verse in that chapter.

Note → Look for opportunities to have conversations about what it means to make a decision to follow Jesus!

### Inclusive Pro Tips

Consider the needs of your group and adjust the activity accordingly.

If any kids prefer to whisper to you instead of share aloud, allow them to do so. Let them hold a beanbag silently as a reminder that God hears their prayers!

Offer adaptive seating or fidget tools to all kids.

## What You Do

1. Invite the kids to sit in a circle..

### Talk Together:

1. Say: "Close your eyes and think quietly about something you feel unready for—something hard or scary you might face at school, home, or in a friendship."
2. Give the kids a few moments to think.
3. Say: "Now, take a moment to ask God to remind you He is with you. And then, ask Him to give you the courage you need to face that situation. Remember, you don't have to do it alone. This is your moment to invite God in. God wants to give you courage when you don't feel ready!"  
→ *Optional: Provide index cards and pencils for kids who'd prefer to write or doodle their prayer.*
4. Close in prayer.

## What You Say

"Dear God, thank You for sending Jesus and giving us the gift of the Holy Spirit. Thank You for promising to always be with us. When we feel nervous, unready, or scared, please remind us that You're right there! Please fill us with courage. And remind us that we can face anything with You. We pray these things in Jesus' name, Amen."

Transition -> As adults arrive to pick up, ask the kids to show them their walking sticks and share how just like a walking stick goes with us every step of the way, God does too
