Pray for your group before they arrive -> Pray for kids who will visit your group for the first time. Thank God that He goes with you through everything and helps you do even bigger things than you could do on your own. Recall an age-appropriate story about when you asked God for help, and He helped you do something bigger than you'd ever thought you'd be able to accomplish. Pray that kids understand that being obedient in the little things over time is a big thing. Ask God to help the kids learn how to go through all of life with Him so they will do all things together with Him!

① What You Do

1. Before you begin, hang butcher paper on the wall with tape or lay it on the floor.
2. Divide the butcher paper with a line down the middle.
3. Label one side of the butcher paper "TEAM 1" and the other "TEAM 2."
4. Divide the kids into two teams and give each team a stack of sticky notes (in their team color).
5. Explain that each team will work together to build a wall on their side of the butcher paper.
 - You will ask a question from the "Story Review" Activity Page. If a team raises a hand and answers correctly first, that team adds a "brick" to its side.
 - If a team answers incorrectly, the other team gets a chance to answer.
6. Continue until all questions are answered.
7. Congratulate the teams for building their walls together.

② What You Say

"Great job, friends! With God, anything is possible!"

"Nehemiah had an important job working for the king, but when he heard that the walls of his hometown were broken and the people were in trouble, he was really sad. So he prayed and asked God for help, then bravely asked the king if he could go rebuild the wall—and the king said yes! God even gave Nehemiah everything he needed for this big project.

"When Nehemiah arrived in Jerusalem, he saw that the walls were in really bad shape. But instead of giving up, he gathered families, friends, and workers from all kinds of jobs to help. They weren't expert builders, but they trusted God and worked together to fix the wall. Even when people made fun of them or tried to stop them, Nehemiah prayed, and kept going.

"In just 52 days, they finished rebuilding the whole wall!"

"Rebuilding the wall was a huge task, but Nehemiah did the whole big task with God. Whenever Nehemiah needed help throughout rebuilding the walls, he prayed. When Nehemiah needed building supplies from the king, he prayed. When he needed help against their enemies, Nehemiah prayed. Nehemiah asked God for what he needed every step of the way, and God gave it to him.

"God never left Nehemiah—He gave Nehemiah everything he needed to do big things! God can help you do big things too!"

STORY REVIEW QUESTIONS

1. What job did Nehemiah have in the palace?

He made sure no one poisoned the king's drink. He was the king's wine taster.

2. What bad news did Nehemiah hear from his homeland?

The wall was broken down, and the gates were burned. The people were in trouble.

3. True or False: Nehemiah didn't care because he had never been to Jerusalem.

False! He wept and prayed to God for days.

4. What did Nehemiah ask King Artaxerxes to let him do?

Go to Jerusalem to rebuild the wall.

5. How did God help Nehemiah when he talked to the king?

The king said yes AND gave him supplies and soldiers for the journey.

6. What did Nehemiah do first when he arrived in Jerusalem?

He waited three days, then went out at night to inspect the walls.

7. True or False: Everyone wanted Nehemiah to rebuild the wall.

False. Sanballat and Tobiah made fun of him and tried to stop him.

8. Were the people who helped Nehemiah expert wall builders?

Nope! They were priests, goldsmiths, perfume makers—even families and kids!

9. When people made fun of Nehemiah and the workers, what did Nehemiah do?

He prayed to God, asked God for help, and told the people to keep building.

10. What happened when the wall was halfway finished?

Enemies made a plan to attack and stop the work.

11. How did Nehemiah keep the people safe while they worked?

He had half the people stand guard and the other half build.

12. How many days did it take to finish the wall and gates?

52 days! That's less than two months.

13. Did Nehemiah and the people do this huge job on their own?

No way! God helped them every step of the way.

14. Finish this sentence: God can help you do _____.

① What You Do

1. Before you begin, place each picture in a different corner or section of your group space.
2. Divide the kids into four teams and send each team to a different image.
3. Ask them to look at the picture and answer:
 - "What big thing might God ask you to do in this picture?"
 - "What might make that hard to do?"
 - "What might you need to ask God to give you in that moment?"
4. Demonstrate by pointing to one of the images.
5. After 2–3 minutes, encourage all of the teams to come back and sit down in a circle together with their pictures.
6. Let each team show their picture and share what they discussed.

Make It Personal -> Share about an age-appropriate time when God asked you to do something that felt tough. Share what it was like to obey God in that moment. What did you ask God to give you to help you?

② What You Say

"You all pointed out some great things in our scenarios! Sometimes God asks us to do big things—things that feel way too hard for us. But the truth is, God never expects us to do those big things alone. Just like Nehemiah, we can talk to God and ask for help, because God can help us do big things!"

"Remember God promises to help you! After all, confidence is not about gritting your teeth and doing everything alone. When you choose to follow Jesus, God sends the Holy Spirit to live in you! That means you never have to face anything alone. You and God's very Spirit face whatever your life brings together every day. And He will help You! Just like Nehemiah asked God for what he needed every step of the way, you can too!"

"You can pray, 'God, I need courage. Please give it to me.' And He will! You can pray, 'God, I need the right words to say. Please give them to me.' And He will!"

"Whatever you need along the way, ask Him for it! Nothing is too big for Him. God can help you do big things!"

Inclusive Pro Tips



To adjust the movement to this activity, invite the kids to stay seated and pass the beach ball around the circle as they recite the verse. You can do this on the floor or around a table.

What You Do

1. Open the Bible and read Isaiah 40:31.
→ NOTE: You can call on an older kid in your group to read the verse too.
2. Review any words that might be unfamiliar to the kids.
3. Teach and review the motions with the group:

These are the motions :

- Those who trust (HOLD PALMS OPEN AND UP TO THE SKY.)
- in the LORD (POINT BOTH HANDS UP TOWARD HEAVEN.)
- will receive (PULL YOUR HANDS IN TOWARD YOUR CHEST LIKE YOU'RE REELING SOMETHING IN.)
- new strength. (SHOW YOUR MUSCLES—FLEX BOTH ARMS WITH A STRONG FACE.)
- They will fly as high as eagles. (FLAP YOUR ARMS SLOWLY AND GRACEFULLY LIKE WINGS.)
- They will run (RUN IN PLACE.)
- and not get tired. (CROSS YOUR ARMS IN FRONT OF YOU IN AN "X.")
- They will walk (TAKE SLOW, STEADY WALKING STEPS IN PLACE.)
- and not grow weak. (CROSS YOUR ARMS AGAIN IN AN "X.")
- Isaiah 40:31 (OPEN PALMS TOGETHER LIKE A BIBLE.)

Move Together:

1. Instruct the kids to stand in a circle.
2. Explain that they will gently throw the beach ball to another kid in the circle while reciting the next word of Isaiah 40:31.
3. Assist the kids with the words as you play.
4. Repeat if time allows. Challenge the kids to not let the beach ball touch the ground for the entire verse.

What You Say

"Wow! Way to remember Isaiah 40:31 this month, friends!

"Keeping the beach ball up was big job, and you helped each other to keep going. God helps us to keep going too! When we trust God, He gives us the strength we need, just like Isaiah 40:31 says. We're not meant to do hard things on our own. When something feels too big or too difficult, we can talk to God, just like Nehemiah did.

"God is strong. God is kind. Good is GOOD! God never gets tired or gives up. And because of who He is, we can live with confidence and keep going, even when things feel tough. Remember, God can help you do big things!"

What You Need

① What You Do

1. Invite kids to sit in a circle.
2. Say, "God loves when we talk to Him, and He's always listening! Let's pray together and thank Him for helping us when we have something big in front of us. After each thing I say, you'll say, 'God can help me do big things!'"
3. After each phrase you read aloud, prompt the kids to respond by saying: "God can help me do big things!"
4. Encourage the kids to say it boldly and with confidence.
5. Then, close in prayer.

Call and Response:

"When I need courage to try something new ..."

(KIDS RESPOND) "God can help me do big things!"

"When I feel too small to make a difference ..."

(KIDS RESPOND) "God can help me do big things!"

"When I want to do what's right even if it's hard ..."

(KIDS RESPOND) "God can help me do big things!"

"When I see someone who needs help ..."

(KIDS RESPOND) "God can help me do big things!"

"When I want to tell others about Jesus ..."

(KIDS RESPOND) "God can help me do big things!"

② Prayer

"God, thank You for always being with us! You never leave us, and You never run out of strength, because You are a Mighty, all-powerful God! When we don't feel brave or strong enough, remind us that we can trust You. Thank You for helping Nehemiah do a big thing, and thank You for helping us too. We want to live every day knowing that You go with us through everything. Teach us to ask You for everything we need. We want to go through life with You! We love You, God, and we pray these things in Jesus' name. Amen!"

Transition → As adults arrive to pick up, encourage kids to share the story of Nehemiah's challenge to rebuild the walls and gates around Jerusalem. Remind them to share the truth that just like God helped Nehemiah: **[BOTTOM LINE]** God can help you do big things.
