

Our Legendary Reader program, which challenges students to read 100 great books, has 100% student participation.


SUMMER PROGRAM

42 students received the life-changing experience of overnight camp at Camp Lookout because of full scholarships donated by the congregation. Centenary campers rated the pool, food, and the end of camp outside communion as their favorite things about camp.

74 students spent eight weeks at our summer day camp receiving two meals a day and enjoying activities including hiphop classes, FCUMC VBS, gym time, art, summer reading, and field trips.



AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM



33,903 questions were answered correctly by students during academic enrichment using IXL Learning, a K-12 learning platform that follows the Hamilton County Schools curriculum.

23 kindergarten and 1st grade students are part of our program this fall. Each day they receive homework help and work with tutors in the Reading Room.

126 students from **19** different schools and **28** zip codes, including **17** 2nd and 3rd generation students, the President and Vice President of the FCUMC Youth Group, **12** athletes on school sports teams and an All East singer attended this year.
