In our modern minds Christmas can become routine and mundane but the first Christmas (and the reality of the incarnation) was any-

thing but! Jesus Christ, the Messiah, the Son of God, came into this world not in triumph and pageantry, but in humility and servanthood. I wonder what that upside nature of the incarnation might mean for how we experience the birth of Christ anew this year? How might God be calling us to be a part of the inverse natures of God's love breaking into the mundane and routine of this world? My Sunday School class is doing an Advent devotion together that focuses on some of our favorite hymns for this time of the year by Charles Wesley (Come Thou Long- Expected Jesus by Paul Wesley Chilcote) and the devotion for Christmas Eve is a powerful reminder of how the gift of the incarnation ought to change our perspective.

Hark! The herald angels sing
"Glory to the new-born king
Peace on earth and mercy mild
God and sinners reconciled"
Joyful all ye nations rise
Join the triumph of the skies
With angelic host proclaim
"Christ is born in Bethlehem"

Dr. Chilcote reminds us that, "Mary births this newborn King so that he might conquer, raise, and give. He comes not to conquer nations, rulers, or people; rather, he destroys the power of death. He comes not to elevate himself; rather, 'he lays his glory by' that he might lift us up as the children of God. But he comes not to condemn; rather, he regenerates us, breathes new life into us so that we might be whole. Why is this night different from all other nights? 'Christ is born in Bethlehem.'"

Everything changed on that first Christmas. Christ was born in Bethlehem, and every Christmas since the gift of the incarnation continues to transform this world. Hark! The herald angels sing "Glory to the new-born king!"
