CLERGY CORNER

When I moved into my current home, there were bushes and a small conifer tree planted in the front bed. Over

the last few years I have faithfully tended these plants, watering and trimming when needed. One day last fall I noticed spider webs in the little conifer tree. I made a mental note and carried on with life. The next time I took the trash out I noticed some browning of the tree, but I was busy with other things to do. Weeks later when I remembered to check on it, my little plant was a goner. As dry and brown and brittle as possible.

I thought I was caring for it in a responsible way, but when it needed special attention I didn't make time. I thought leaving it alone to mostly take care of itself would continue to work, but I did not factor in the lethality of tiny spider mites. I did not stop long enough to consider the profound effect of a small and seemingly insignificant clue.

As followers of Christ, we are called to keep our eyes open, to pay attention to the small clues all around us that give information about what is actually happening. When we do, we can respond as one whose life depends on God's love through Christ Jesus. We will always be called to notice and act in persistent love as we choose what is important and what to overlook. A lot is happening these days, so "keep your eyes open, hold tight to your convictions, give it all you've got, be resolute, and love without stopping." (1 Corinthians 16:13-14, MSG)
