On February 2, the Oak Street Playhouse will open its first musical in around 15 years. "Always, Patsy Cline" is inspired by letters the legendary country singer wrote to a longtime fan, Louise Seger. It contains many of Cline's biggest hits, humor and emotion and has not been performed in Chattanooga in more than 20 years.

The playhouse is pleased to be able to present the musical because of a grant from the Permanent Endowment Fund, which helped pay for the extra royalties, a musical director and musicians.

The grant also purchased upgrades for the theater's sound system — two new speakers, a new receiver and a new Chromebook to play the sound cues during shows. The sound system upgrades also benefit the children's ministry, which meets in the Flo Summit Theatre.

Oak Street Playhouse, which is always looking for new volunteers for set construction, costumes, actors, and host duties, appreciates the grant for this nearly 45-year-old church outreach.

We want to note that changing your personal information will change the information the church has for you, which gives you the ability to update your current information. It also means if you delete it, it will affect our ability to continue sending things like the newsletter, financial statements, etc.




