CLERGY CORNER

There is the story of a rabbi who asked his students, "How will you know when night has

ended and the day has begun?"
One student raised his hand and wondered, "Is it when you can tell a dog from a sheep in the dim light?"
Another student said, "Is it when you can distinguish a fig tree from a grapevine?" The rabbi shook his head. "No, it is when you can look at the face of another person, stranger or enemy, and recognize them as your sister or brother. That is when a new day has begun."

This story might sound like pie in the sky preacher talk, but it's not. Isaiah 58:6-12 explains what God's vision of a new day will look like. The people will choose freedom instead of oppression, hunger, poverty, and housing issues will be eliminated, and strangers will be welcomed with open arms. May we have the courage to love our neighbors as ourselves, and to love God with all our heart, mind, soul and strength as we seek to bring about a new day for God's glory.

The Book of Names will be on the altar on November 2nd as a reminder of our communion with these precious saints.






