In April 1986, the worst nuclear disaster in human history happened at the Chernobyl **Nuclear Power** Plant in Ukraine.

The disaster left a 30+ mile radius of unlivable environment. The cause was one employee's choice to continue a standard test under inappropriate conditions. The disaster was made worse by other poor choices in construction and communication. Recently, though, according to a November 2024 article in Forbes magazine, a fungus has been found in the reactor that exploded. This fungus has figured out a way to multiply and thrive by extracting energy from the radiation. Scientists wonder if this tiny fungus might be a tool to heal areas affected by toxic levels of radiation.

As Christians, we know that small things make a big difference. Even small things like fungus can and do create beautiful things even in the midst of terrible circumstances. Yeast, for example, is a friendly fungus that creates soft and fluffy bread. Mushrooms are fungus, and penicillin is created from fungus.

There can be life-giving, transformative power in small things. The small choices we make are impactful. How we choose to think about, pray for, and perceive others is a small act that has a profound result in the world. How we choose to address or ignore injustices has a profound result in the world. How we choose to nurture our relationship with Christ and courageously live into His teachings has a profound result in our ability to be transformed into the image of Christ for the service of others. It all comes down to conscious and intentional choices. Together our small choices make a big difference. May all our choices bring healing for the hurts of our world.
