As this month's message I'm sharing our UWF report to the church council:

United Women in Faith Report to Church Council, August 20, 2025

Our unit is using the somewhat quieter summer to plan for the coming year and beyond. We want to establish our Vision and design our actions to match that Vision. At this point we are brainstorming and attempting to consolidate our ideas. Our hope is that every decision and every action will align with that Vision.

Some of the themes emerging from discussion: more organized outreach to women within F-C; connecting with and collaborating with other UM Churches to support our new, larger District;

focusing on UMC social principles and UWF social action; providing more hands-on opportunities for service; and deepening spiritual growth.

Since our last Church Council meeting our unit hosted the CALEB General Meeting and gave a presentation about our church, our UWF, and how our Christian beliefs and practices align with the social justice goals of CALEB.

We were fortunate to be able to send 2 UWF members to the Children's Defense Fund Hall-Proctor Institute during July. Camille (Mason) Rambajue and Cheri Harr were inspired by their experience and returned with wonderful ideas which they shared with our unit. (Power Point attached)

In September through CALEB we will be supporting whole-school restorative practices training at Hardy Elementary School, and we will also be training all Hamilton County Schools pre-k teachers. In October training will begin at Hixson Elementary. In October the International Institutes of Restorative Practices will hold its world-wide conference here in Chattanooga, and our CALEB Educational Taskforce will be doing a workshop.

Finally, as the Scenic South District emerges in its new, larger configuration, there are many challenges, but also lots of opportunity in coming months. We hope to do our part in connecting with new friends in overcoming challenges and taking advantage of new opportunities.


