\*Affirmation of Faith From The Confession of 1967, §§9.45–9.46

In Jesus Christ, God was reconciling the world to himself. We believe this reconciliation is the ground of peace, justice, and freedom among the nations.

The church lives out this calling when it practices forgiveness and seeks peace across every line of conflict. We believe Christ summons us to risk comfort and security for the sake of cooperation and understanding.

Nations may serve God's purposes in history, but no nation or way of life may claim God as its possession. We confess that when the church identifies the cause of God with the power of the state, it denies the Lordship of

God's reconciliation in Christ makes plain: enslaving poverty in a world of abundance is intolerable. Because Jesus identified with the needy and the exploited, the cause of the poor is the cause of his disciples.

The church cannot evade responsibility in economic affairs, nor condone poverty through silence or indifference.

We believe all gifts and resources are entrusted to us by God— to sustain families, to build community, and to advance the common welfare.

A church indifferent to poverty, or open to one social class only, mocks God's reconciling love.

We believe true worship is shown in justice and mercy, as we follow Christ who casts down the mighty and lifts up the lowly.





This was written during the troubled 1960's and the civil rights movement in response to civil religion. Its central doctrines include reconciliation and the equality of all persons. Banner: The Blue, Red and Gold: Colors of the official seal of the United Presbyterian Church in the United States of America; The Golden, Downreaching Hand: (repeated from the Nicene Banner) God reaching down to his world; The Crown (repeated from the Westminster Banner) and the Nail Scarred Hand: The death and victory of Christ; The Four Hands of Different Colors, the Clasped Hands, and the Green Circle: The reconciled world at the foot of the cross; The Stars and Planets on the Blue Background: The Space-Age Setting of this confession.
