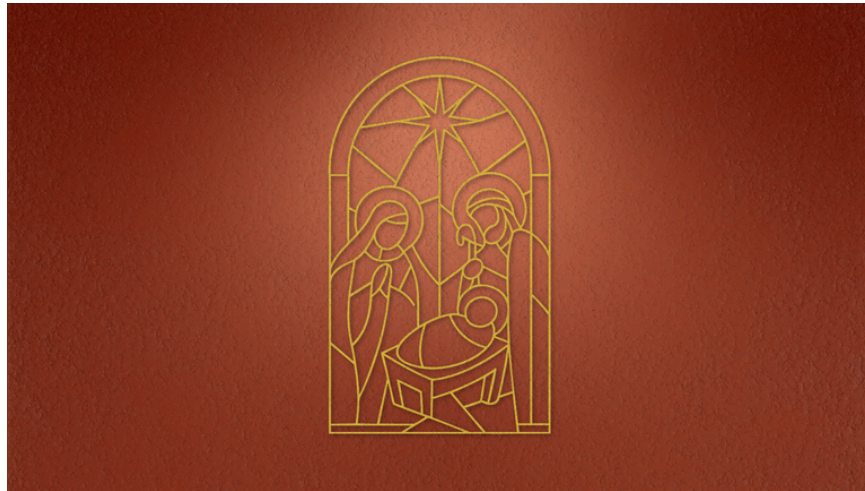





# Mary Margaret Heath

## Choral Music Endowment



Mary Margaret Heath (1930-2009) was an unusually gifted vocalist from a young age, performing in Methodist Churches and social gatherings in Dallas, Texas throughout her youth.

From 1956-1966, Mary was the contralto soloist at First Methodist Church of Wichita Falls and sang regularly in programs at the Women's Forum there. From 1966-2006, she participated in vocal music in a variety of settings in Oklahoma City, such as Lyric Theater, the Master Chorale, and various Oklahoma City churches, including many years at Westminster Presbyterian Church.

As Dr. Heath, she had an active counseling psychology practice in Oklahoma City. She served as a member of the Oklahoma State Licensing Board for a number of years, culminating her service by chairing the same board. She had also served as a teacher in the Oklahoma City Public Schools in the 1970's before receiving her doctoral degree from the University of Oklahoma in 1981.

In 1996, her son, Clifford Hudson, and his wife, Leslie, formed and endowed the Mary Margaret Heath Choral Music Endowment, which has since been the funding source for the commissioning of original choral music pieces. The endowment is managed by and held at the Oklahoma City Community Foundation.
