My dear Westies,

There's a line I've used in sermons before: the Holy Spirit is the gift of God's self to the Church. It's not a performance or a spectacle - it's presence. It's power. It's how the Church becomes the Church.

This fall, we're beginning a long and layered journey through the Book of Acts, a series we're calling Empowered: The Spirit, the Church, and the World. It will carry us from September all the way to Easter 2026. And if that sounds like a lot of Acts - well, it is. But I promise you: Acts is a story worth lingering in.

It's the story of the first Christians - ordinary people - learning to live in a world that didn't revolve around them. And doesn't that sound familiar?

The world of the first century wasn't built for the Church. It didn't cater to Christian values or make space for resurrection talk. But that didn't stop the apostles. They preached. They healed. They gathered. They made mistakes. They forgave each other. They kept going. All because the Spirit had empowered them to be who they couldn't be on their own.

In our own time - when Christianity no longer occupies the center of cultural life - Acts offers us not just a map, but a mirror. What does it mean to be the Church in 2025, when the old assumptions no longer hold? How do we live out the message of grace, peace, love, and justice in a world that tells a very different story?

That's what this series is about.

Over the coming months, we'll follow the spread of the gospel from Jerusalem to Judea to the ends of the earth. We'll encounter courage and conflict, surprise and surrender. We'll meet people who gave everything for a kingdom they couldn't always see - but whose power they could never deny.

Westminster is a vibrant and growing congregation. Like those early believers, we are being shaped and sent by a Spirit who is always on the move. So let's walk this road together - with open hearts, ready minds, and a willingness to be empowered by something larger than ourselves.

I can't wait to see where the Spirit leads.

Greetings WPC members,

I have always loved everything Fall—hot apple cider, a cozy sweater, and the renewed energy that fills the life of the church. It's the season when Sunday School resumes, small groups gather, and we re-engage in the rhythm of worship, learning, and fellowship, as Christian Education programming kicks off on Sunday, September 7 at 9:30 AM, followed by the Deacons' Picnic. This fall, I'm especially excited to see the fruits of our summer planning come to life. The Spiritual Formation Department at Westminster invites you to journey deeper into faith—exploring how creativity and theology intertwine and rediscovering the joy of learning together. Whether you've been here for years or are new to our community, there's a place for you. As Christian educator Dr. Elizabeth Caldwell reminds us, "Christian education is not about depositing information but cultivating relationships that allow transformation to take place." That's the spirit behind our fall offerings. We're embracing the season as an opportunity to offer the congregation more ways to participate in shared Spiritual Formation—celebrating intergenerational community and recognizing we are all lifelong learners as children of God.

One exciting change this fall is the reimagining of our Mid-Week Manna series. Traditionally, this Wednesday evening program includes separate classes and activities for adults, youth, and children. But this year, the Spiritual Formation Committee, in collaboration with the Worship and the Arts Team, is introducing a fresh, intergenerational format designed to bring the entire church family together. Rather than separating into different rooms and age groups, participants of all ages will share the same creative spiritual experience. This year's fall Mid-Week Manna 4-week evening series, *Divine Echoes: Art, Music, and the Mystery of Faith*, invites us to explore how creative expression—through music, dance, and storytelling—can become a window into the sacred. Each week will feature a unique blend of live performance, personal testimony, theological reflection, and group conversation, engaging people of all ages in shared spiritual discovery.

At Westminster, we celebrate that intergenerational spiritual formation isn't just a program—it's a way of being the church. It's about making space for people of all ages to learn, worship, and share stories side by side. Dr. Joyce Ann Mercer, a leading voice in practical theology, puts it this way: "Intergenerational relationships are not optional extras—they are central to how faith is transmitted and lived."

Here are a few simple ways to begin:

- Sit with someone younger or older than you in worship. Break your routine. Choose a different pew—near a young family, a teen, or an older adult you don't usually sit with.
- Share a meal across generations. During Wednesday dinners or church events, invite someone from a different age group to join your table.
- Learn someone's name. Greet children, youth, or elders by name on Sunday mornings.
- Offer a word of encouragement. Write a note to someone of another generation. Affirm their gifts—kindness, wisdom, joy, curiosity.

These are just a few ideas. Because intergenerational relationships aren't just "nice to have"—they're essential to the life of the church. Through connection, curiosity, and care, we reflect the beauty of God's family—where every generation has something to give and something to receive. Please mark your calendars as some of our youngest in the congregation lead our 10:30 AM worship service on November 2. And take time to explore the rest of this newsletter for more details on these and other Spiritual Formation events and opportunities.

Big Faith Resources Update

As we reflect on the past few months, we're filled with gratitude for how this season has brought growth and momentum to Big Faith Resources. Together, we're continuing to build accessible, inclusive, and welcoming spaces where people of all ages and abilities can worship, connect, and truly belong.

Here's a glimpse at what we've been up to lately:

Video Series

We're excited to announce the completion of the second video in our "Neurodiversity and the Church" series. In this installment, three families at different stages of life share their journeys with neurodiversity and faith. This video will soon be available to congregations as a powerful tool for building awareness and fostering a more inclusive church community.

Ferncliff

In May, we had the opportunity to visit Ferncliff to train camp counselors on creating a more inclusive environment for neurodiverse campers. We also helped design a calming space called the "Alone Zone," where campers can retreat when they need a quiet moment to recharge.

Vacation Bible School

In June, we focused on making our Vacation Bible School more inclusive by introducing a sensory-friendly component. Many of our youth served as Buddies, pairing with individual children to offer support and connection. We also created a quiet sensory room in the middle of the VBS space. These meaningful changes helped make the week a joyful and welcoming experience for all.

First Annual Advisory Team Meeting

At the end of June, we gathered for our very first Annual Advisory Team Meeting for Big Faith Resources. Six dedicated advisory team members joined us for the multi-day event. It was a rich and inspiring time of building relationships and dreaming together about the future of Big Faith Resources.

Sunday School

In August, we led a three-part teaching series on neurodiversity for the Adventurers class. A highlight of the series was a powerful presentation by guest speaker Alexander Vladimir Powell, who shared his personal journey and insights on living with neurodiversity.

Sensory Friendly Worship

We have loved seeing families, friends, and our beloved therapy dogs in our Sensory Friendly Worship in Frederickson Hall each Sunday. This service continues to grow as a welcoming space where everyone can worship together in a way that honors diverse needs and experiences.

We're deeply grateful for the support, prayers, and dedicated volunteers who make our mission possible. Every small moment of inclusion contributes to a greater movement—one where Big Faith Resources continues to grow and create spaces where everyone belongs.

Greetings,

We have had a busy summer at WPC. The highlight being spending two weeks with the sweetest campers at Shiloh Adventure camp. Huge thanks to the volunteers, staff, and missions team that made it all happen. We cooked, delivered and served 3,000 meals!

There are plans to host a Fall family day at White Fields for our HopeHouse moms and kids. Stay tuned for details. If you have not been there, it is an awesome place!

As the holiday season approaches, I feel so grateful for the opportunity to help so many people in need. The cost of food is rising, and benefits have dwindled for our families. We expect a surge in need around the holidays. It is always difficult to turn a family away. We are currently serving 36 families with groceries. This holiday season we will be serving about 50 families with holiday meals, and 95 children with stockings.

We will begin the season with Thanksgiving dinner for our families. There will be 4 days to cook, beginning Sunday November 23rd after church at 11:30 AM. There will be lunch and drinks provided. We will pack the meals and deliver them on Thanksgiving morning. Delivery is a great chance to meet the people we serve.

We have lots of stockings to fill! Please look online and sign up to sponsor a child. Remember for some of these kids it could be all they receive. We will try to have the stockings filled by December 15th.

You Are Loved is an event at The Homeless Alliance where we'll serve a hot lunch and provide new hoodies, hats, gloves, snack bags, hot hands, pet food, and hygiene bags for 350 of our homeless friends. It's a big effort that we can only do together—a chance to serve and remind our friends they are already deeply loved. Jesus said, "My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you."

We'll take 30 volunteers per shift. That same day at WPC, we'll prepare over 1,000 Christmas meals for Dinner with Love, with opportunities to bake cookies, prep green beans, fill snack bags, assemble boxes, and write notes—all to the sound of Christmas music and snacks to enjoy. Both locations are great ways for families to serve together.

Dinner with Love will also be at WPC on December 23rd. It will be a busy day of cooking, packing, and delivery. The kitchen will be preparing green beans and sweet potatoes. Upstairs they will be packing boxes with beans, rice, rolls, pies, and hams. There will be a sign-up online as well as at WPC.

Please remember Meals on Wheels prepare and deliver food every Tuesday and Thursday. They are always in need of cooks and drivers! Contact Judy Hamra or Barbara Hill. We are so grateful for the hard work they put in to make this program successful!

Camp Shiloh will be hosting their campers and counselors over the holidays. They will need cookie donations if you are interested, please let me know.

"Burnt Offerings", our church cookbook is available for sale online or at the front desk. It makes a great gift with the proceeds going to Feed My Sheep.

It seems appropriate in closing to thank you all for your support of all the missions projects we undertake. We cannot do this without you!
