Title: Spend Less

Text: Selected Scriptures

Big Idea: Spending less doesn't mean spending nothing. Rather, it means biblically evaluating how much

you spend, what motives drive your spending, and how others are affected by it.

DISCUSS THE ISSUE

It may be argued that the fastest growing religion in the world is consumerism. In what ways do you get caught up in the distraction of "needing more."

Consider all the holiday advertisements you're exposed to. How can you become more aware and less susceptible to messages that say our lives are lacking something?

EXPLORE THE TRUTH

Read Matthew 6:19-24. Where did Jesus urge his followers not to store up treasures?

Why does Jesus discourage stockpiling earthly treasures?

Where does Jesus encourage us to invest? Why? How can we practically do this?

What does the location of a person's treasure say about that person's heart?

What analogy does Jesus make in vs. 22-23? How does this relate to his discussion of where one stores up their treasure?

What did Jesus say about serving two masters? What two masters did Jesus mention, and why did he choose these?
